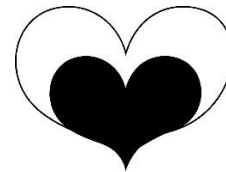

From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday we hear of Jesus as being determined to continue the journey to Jerusalem where He would accomplish the Father's plan of salvation. Along the way someone says that he would follow Jesus wherever He goes. The Lord makes it clear that following Him does not guarantee one's security. He himself had nowhere to rest His head. Jesus then invites three fellow travelers to "Follow me." Each of them replies with an excuse as to why they cannot follow Jesus without first taking care of other matters.

When Jesus calls us to follow Him, what prevents us from doing so wholeheartedly? Is there something in our lives that we consider more important than being His disciple? Do we make excuses and look back and not keep our vision fixed on what lies ahead? Today the Lord urges us to put aside whatever there is within us that stands in the way of following Him completely.

This week we celebrate the Fourth of July, the 243rd anniversary of the founding of our nation. We think of all those who struggled years ago to win independence and establish this country. Although we have our problems and divisions, we thank God that we are able to live here with the freedoms that we enjoy and that are often taken for granted. May God continue to bless America and each one of us.

Words of Inspiration:

The Freedom of Discipleship...

In today's Gospel, Jesus makes a strange remark. Who of us would have joined a religious community just when our parents were dying? And how much criticism would a person come under if he or she chose to escape the painful duty of burying their parents by embracing a group that demands the neglect of those responsibilities? Here's the comforting thing: it goes much deeper than it looks. In Jesus' day, the demands of sons in the year-long process of burying their parents were immense. Some of this included re-burying the decomposed body a year later by placing the bones in an ossuary in the family tomb. And Jesus knew that, in time, the graves of all believers would be empty. So be at peace, he said, and follow me.
