

READINGS  
**HIS WORD TODAY** by Rev. William J. Reilly

**Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**  
July 21, 2019


**“Abraham saw three men standing nearby. When he saw them, he ran from the entrance of the tent to greet them; and bowing to the ground, he said, ‘Sir, if I may ask you this favor, please do not go on past your servant. Let some water be brought, that you may bathe your feet, and then rest yourselves under the tree. Now that you have come this close to your servant, let me bring you a little food, that you may refresh yourselves; and afterward you may go on your way...and he waited on them under the tree while they ate.”**

During the hot, hazy, dusty days of summer we find the Genesis story welcome relief. Don't we all seek some help at this time of the year, a gentle breeze, a quiet fan or air conditioning? Imagine how welcome was this encounter with Abraham.

A fundamental principle in the Christian life is found in the virtue of hospitality. Saint Benedict likened it to prayer. Jesus found it in the home of Martha, Mary and Lazarus. We have often experienced it in visits, being welcomed into a new parish community or home. We can offer this gift to others at little cost to ourselves. The first to come to mind are immigrants and refugees.

Jesus fled to Egypt following no acceptance at the inn. Those fleeing the ravages of war, gangs and poverty at our borders, might be the God hidden from recognition in the book of Genesis. Our gift of hospitality reveals the compassion of Jesus Christ to others.

On Saturday morning, June 12th, over 30 families visited the Clothing Boutique. It was quite busy. The space is small, so only 10 shoppers are allowed in at a time. Most of the morning there was a line out the door. The families were cheerful and waited patiently. Many split up, the husbands shopped in the food pantry while the wives and children shopped the boutique. Working at the boutique is just one of the many volunteer opportunities available at the CCNW.


The food pantry, on average is feeding 2000 clients a month. Every donated food item reduces the amount of money spent on needed foods. This enables the food pantry to support its efforts to build their clients' work skills. The CCNW recently started a food service class with 8 attendees. With a food service certificate, it is expected that they will be more employable. The CCNW is also offering makers classes for seamstresses and craftspeople and training others in retail sales at their Community Shop, the new thrift store in Katonah.

The CCNW has also registered for next Fall's Christmas Boutique at St. Patrick's school. They will be selling many of their makers' products like Consuelo's hand crocheted infant apparel. It was such a success last year.

After 5 years of delivering food to the CCNW for St. Patrick's, Bob Hart has retired from this effort. We thank him for his considerable efforts...in good weather and bad...all of your food donations made it to the CCNW on time and in perfect condition. Thank you, Bob Hart!

Fortunately, we have several seniors to fill Bob's shoes. We are also trying to involve more students and families in our food delivery efforts. We thank Garbiella DeCicco for writing the bulletin announcement for July, preparing the bags in the Church vestibule and collecting and delivering over 25 bags of food to the CCNW. In August, the Hoffman family has volunteered to assist.

All we need now are more food donations for our volunteer deliverers! Thank you to everyone for all that you give to the CCNW!
