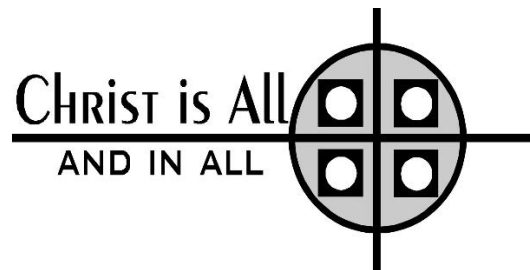

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY  
READINGS  
HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time  
August 4, 2019

**“Someone in the crowd said to Jesus, ‘Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me.’ He replied to him, ‘Friend, who appointed me as your judge and arbitrator?’ Then he said to the crowd, ‘Take care to guard against all greed, for though a man may be rich, one’s life does not consist of possessions.’”**

Without being fully aware, it is easy to fall into the trap of greed or avarice. Like the tiny squirrel, we gather and collect, thinking we are in need, cannot do without, and even forget what we have accumulated. The gospel teaching is a gentle reminder.

Consider all possessions as gift. I was not born with them and when the Lord calls me, they will be left behind. Our consumer society measures and praises what one possesses.

A good lesson for us is to look at the gift of health, of family, of service, as the riches I have. It is not what I have that counts, but what I do with the gifts I have been given. To see my children and grandchildren, their joy and accomplishments as treasures. Where my heart is, there is my treasure.

### *Hidden with Christ in God*

There is only one thing you must definitely answer for yourself: “Who am I?” Or, restated, “Where do I abide?” If you get this right the rest largely takes care of itself. Paul answers the questions directly: “You are hidden with Christ in God, and Christ is your life” (Col 3:3-4). Every time you start hating yourself ask, “Who am I?” The answer: “I am hidden with Christ in God” in every part of my life. I am bearing both the mystery of suffering humanity and the mystery of God’s glory, which is precisely the mystery of Christ. God looks at us and always sees Christ, and so finds us always and entirely lovable. And one day we will find God entirely loveable and ourselves fully loveable in the same moment.

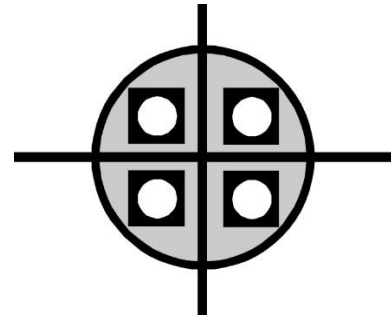
