**Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
August 11, 2019**

Respect Life Committee Spiritual Adoption Program Month 8

We are in the home stretch with our spiritually adopted babies. A layer of fat is produced and stored beneath the skin for insulation and also as a food supply. Antibodies that give immunity to diseases are building up. The center of the bones is still hardening, but the bones in the head are soft and flexible for delivery. The baby is completely formed, just growing in size and strength. The baby weighs about 4-6 pounds and is about 16-18 long.

Contemplative Prayer Retreat September 23-26,2019

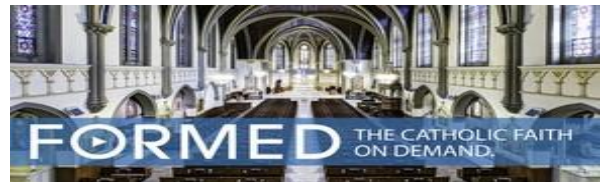
