MUSIC AT THE BASILICA

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

For this festive weekend, the organ music hails from America. The Prelude was written by James Bremner (d. 1780), a relative of the Edinburgh composer and publisher Robert Bremner. James came to Philadelphia in 1763 as a music teacher and organist of Christ Church. Among his pupils was Francis Hopkinson, a gifted writer, composer, and statesman who was one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence, and also the designer of the American flag. The Communion is by Manuel Emilio (1812-1871), a native of Spain who settled in Salem, Massachusetts some time prior to 1844. He became organist of one of the Catholic churches there, and though his published works are few, an entire collection exists in the library of the Essex Institute in Salem. W. Eugene Thayer (1838-1889) was born in Mendon, Massachusetts and studied with John Knowles Paine at Harvard. In the 1860's he spent two years of study in Germany, and on his return served in several Boston churches. Between 1881 and 1886 he was organist of Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church in New York City, and trained an entire generation of organists.

The final hymn has a revolutionary theme. Jean Sibelius (1865-1957) was a Finnish violinist and composer of the late Romantic period. The hymn's melody comes from his Opus 26 Finlandia, a symphonic poem. The piece was composed for the Press Celebrations of 1899, a covert protest against increasing censorship from the Russian Empire, and was the last of seven pieces performed as an accompaniment to a tableau depicting episodes from Finnish history. Most of the piece is taken up with rousing and turbulent music, evoking the national struggle of the Finnish people. Towards the end, a calm comes over the orchestra, and the serenely melodic Finlandia Hymn is heard. Often incorrectly cited as a traditional folk melody, the hymn section is of Sibelius's own creation. The text itself is American (Lloyd Stone 1912-1993).

You may have noticed flyers for a new piece of music called "the public domain" in the narthex. As part of Lincoln Center's Mostly Mozart festival, Pulitzer Prize winner David Lang will be premiering this work, which features a 1,000-voice volunteer choir. Sections of the choir are in rehearsal at the Basilica, led by renowned choral conductor Simon Halsey. The piece will be presented outdoors on Lincoln Center's campus on August 13, 5:00 PM in Josie Robertson Plaza. It will be a free event.

SHEEP AT THE BASILICA

They're coming! This summer three sheep will arrive from *White Barn Farm* in upstate New Paltz. We are scheduled to see the sheep grazing in the south cemetery during the months of August and September. The NYC Dept. of Health requires that farm animals be limited to a 60 day stay in Manhattan so we chose months that include the dates for Festival of San Gennaro, September 15-25. This year we will include educational sessions that will teach about the values and use of natural wool and other sheep products. Remember too that sheep are theologically advantaged animals: they are the most frequently mentioned animal in the Bible besides humans. They are also easy to care for since they are placid, pre-occupied with eating and sleeping and will only eat grass products.

The Holy Doors of Mercy

The Basilica of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral is honored, with the blessing of Cardinal Dolan, to have HOLY DOORS at its sister church, the Shrine Church of the Most Precious Blood for the duration of the Holy Year. With these Holy Doors open 24hrs a day, pilgrims passing through them will benefit from indulgences and blessings. Pilgrims will reflect on the major theme of the Holy Year – the universal reach of God's mercy – by viewing a display of presepio, crafted in this city of Naples by La Scarabattola.

For those in a state of grace a plenary indulgence may be gained once day by passing through the Holy Doors. A plenary indulgence removes all punishment due to sin.

Those seeking the indulgence are encouraged to begin a pilgrimage at the Basilica of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral. The pilgrim then may proceed down to the Shrine Church of the Most Precious Blood where the Holy Doors of Mercy are located.

THE SERMON ON THE MOUNT: Is it possible to be Christian???

Tuesday, July 12 from 7:30 to 8:30 PM

As an introduction to studying the New Testament, this session will focus on "Sermon on the Mount" found in the Gospel of Matthew, Chapters 5-7. The issues of Inspiration, Canonization, Authorship will be reviewed as well as an overview of how and why Matthew composed this "Charter of Christian Conduct".

COMING IN THE FALL

A three-session course called "An Introduction to the New Testament". Students will meet on one evening for three consecutive weeks (dates to be determined). The course will provide a foundation for further exploration into the other parts of the Bible such as the Pentateuch, Prophets, Psalms, Gospels, Acts, Letters, Revelation. This three-session course will be repeated three or four times during the year in order to attract newcomers to Bible study.

Meanwhile, there will be other courses on the Bible for people who have completed the "Introduction" or who have enough of a foundation to take mini-courses on the sections of the Bible mentioned in the paragraph above.

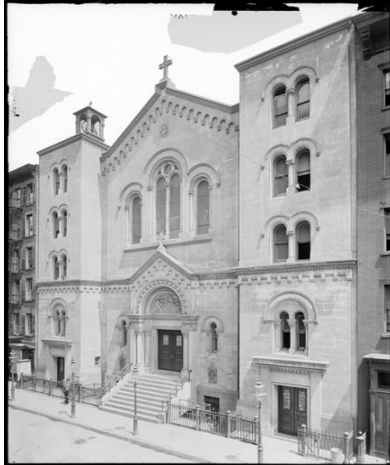
BULLETIN NEWS – JULY 2-3, 2016
