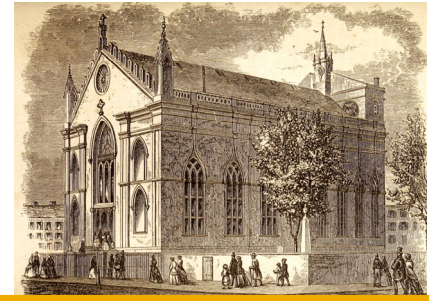

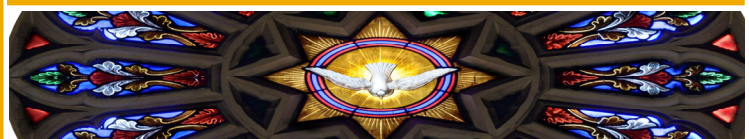

Starting Monday, June 1st, the Basilica will be open seven days a week, from 11:30am until 2pm. Face masks will be required to enter the basilica, and pews have been roped off to maintain proper distancing. Our staff will be sanitizing the basilica on a regular basis.

Also, confession will be available on Saturdays from 11:30am until 12 noon. Weather permitting, confessions will be in the courtyard in front of the main entrance to the basilica on Mott Street. If the weather is inclement, confessions will be in the undercroft. Confession has always been available by appointment, and that will continue as well.

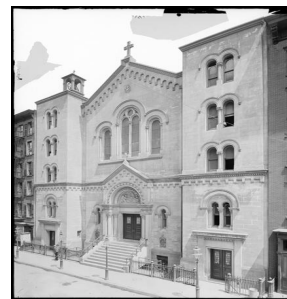
