Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus depiction of the Jewish nation as God's vineyard would be familiar to his listeners. The details were similar to those of Isaiah's parable of the house of Israel, the vineyard of the Lord, set apart and cherished by God for his particular favor.

The story of the wicked tenants is an allegory of salvation history. God the owner of the vineyard, left the people in the care and protection of religious and political leaders. Their responsibility was to bring the people to fruitfulness in knowing, loving and obeying God so they might continue to enjoy his love and protection. From time to time God sent his prophets to remind the people of this purpose, but the prophets were abused, rejected and even murdered. Finally, God sent his Son, but he too was reviled and put to death.

Jesus' mission on earth was to form the Church, a new people of God, united by submission and obedience to the Father's will, they would live out the fullness of God's life and love, and would one day enjoy the eternal inheritance promised to all the faithful. We are often like the tenants who sought by devious means to obtain the owner's inheritance, and thus become our own lord and master. There is a pride in the human heart that spurs us to take control of our lives and find fulfillment apart from God and obedience to him.

God's earnest desire is that the members of his Church listen to and commit their lives to his Son as they hear God's word in prayer, scripture, and celebration of the liturgy. It is only through Jesus and in union with him that we can recognize the voice of the Holy Spirit. As we hear his voice we turn to God, and we will have no anxiety about anything, and our minds will be raised to heavenly realities, enabling us to think about whatever is true, honorable, just, pure, lovely and gracious.

Vigésimo-Séptimo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

La descripción de Jesús de la nación judía como la viña de Dios sería familiar para sus oyentes. Los detalles eran similares a los de la parábola de Isaías de la casa de Israel, la viña del Señor, apartada y apreciada por Dios por su favor particular.

La historia de los labradores malvados es una alegoría de la historia de la salvación. Dios, dueño de la viña, dejó al pueblo al cuidado y protección de líderes religiosos y políticos. Su responsabilidad era hacer que la gente fructificara al conocer, amar y obedecer a Dios para que pudieran continuar disfrutando de su amor y protección. De vez en cuando, Dios envió a sus profetas para recordarle a la gente este propósito, pero los profetas fueron abusados, rechazados e incluso asesinados. Finalmente, Dios envió a su Hijo, pero él también fue insultado y condenado a muerte.

La misión de Jesús en la tierra fue formar la Iglesia, un nuevo pueblo de Dios, unidos por la sumisión y obediencia a la voluntad del Padre, vivirían la plenitud de la vida y el amor de Dios, y algún día disfrutarían de la herencia eterna prometida a todos los fieles. A menudo somos como los inquilinos que buscaban por medios tortuosos obtener la herencia del propietario, y así convertirnos en nuestro propio amo y señor. Hay un orgullo en el corazón humano que nos impulsa a tomar el control de nuestras vidas y encontrar la plenitud fuera de Dios y la obediencia a él.

El deseo ferviente de Dios es que los miembros de su Iglesia escuchen y entreguen sus vidas a su Hijo como escuchan la palabra de Dios en oración, escritura y celebración de la liturgia. Solo a través de Jesús y en unión con él podemos reconocer la voz del Espíritu Santo. Al escuchar su voz, nos volvemos a Dios, y no sentiremos ansiedad por nada, y nuestra mente se elevará a las realidades celestiales, lo que nos permitirá pensar en todo lo que es verdadero, honorable, justo, puro, hermoso y misericordioso.

Words of Our Lady of Fatima on the Holy Rosary

Pray the Rosary every day, in order to obtain peace for the world, and the end of the war.

...**May 13, 1917**

I wish you to come here on the 13th of next month, to pray the Rosary each day.

June 13, 1917

I want you to come here on the 13th of next month, and to continue praying the Rosary every day in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary, in order to obtain peace for the world and the end of the war, because only She can help you

July 13, 1917

I want you to continue praying the Rosary every day. ...**August 19, 1917**

Continue to say the Rosary to obtain the end of the war. ...**September 13, 1917**

I am Our Lady of the Rosary. Continue to say the Rosary every day. ...**October 13, 1917**

You at least try to console Me and announce in My name that I promise to assist at the moment of death, with all the graces necessary for salvation, all those who, on the First Saturday of five consecutive months shall confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep Me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making Reparation to Me.

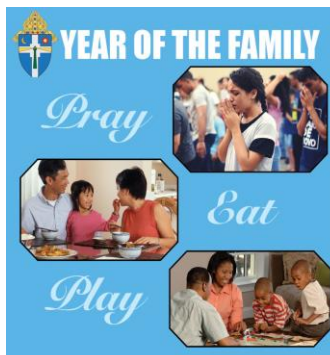

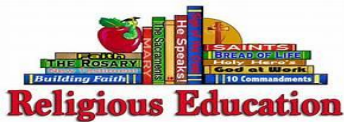
