## **Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

In his abundant mercy, God invites people to the royal banquet for the wedding of his Son to the Church. The prophet Isaiah announced the Lord's invitation: On the mountain the Lord of Hosts will make for all peoples a feast. In the parable of the wedding feast, we again read of a banquet open to all people, a feast from which no one is excluded.

Isaiah and Jesus both emphasized that the Lord's invitation was not an exclusive, high-society event. All are invited regardless of state in life, position in the community, material wealth, race, age or handicap. The mixing of social groups was just as radical a concept in Isaiah's and Jesus' time as it is in ours. The Pharisees of Jesus' day, for instance, shunned tax collectors and sinners, but these sinners often accepted Jesus before the self-righteous Pharisees did. Today the educated and financially secure often shun the Gospel, while the poor and humble embrace it eagerly.

In the sacrament of the Eucharist, God invites all people to taste his great love. As we participate in the liturgy of the Eucharist, God increases our desire and readiness for the heavenly banquet that is to come. How we will respond to the Lord's invitation to the wedding banquet of his Son? Will we be too preoccupied with worldly affairs to accept it humbly? Or will we respond with hearts overflowing with love and gratitude for the Lord's gift of refreshment and the opportunity to dwell in his house forever?

Jesus said: Many are called, but few are chosen. The king rejected the improperly dressed man because he did not regard his invitation as a great honor. Consequently, he did not bother to clothe himself with the new nature, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness of God. The guests who were dressed in wedding garments recognized God's abundant mercy and love as the only source of strength and hope, and so they were clothed themselves with his mercy.

## **Vigésimo-Octavo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario**

En su abundante misericordia, Dios invita a la gente al banquete real de la boda de su Hijo a la Iglesia. El profeta Isaías anunció la invitación del Señor: En el monte, el Señor de los ejércitos hará una fiesta para todos los pueblos. En la parábola de la fiesta de bodas, leemos nuevamente acerca de un banquete abierto a todos, una fiesta de la que nadie está excluido. Tanto Isaías como Jesús enfatizaron que la invitación del Señor no era un evento exclusivo de la alta sociedad. Todos están invitados sin importar su estado de vida, posición en la comunidad, riqueza material, raza, edad o discapacidad. La mezcla de grupos sociales era un concepto tan radical en la época de Isaías y Jesús como en la nuestra. Los fariseos de la época de Jesús, por ejemplo, evitaban a los recaudadores de impuestos y a los pecadores, pero estos pecadores a menudo aceptaban a Jesús antes que los fariseos fariseos. Hoy en día, los educados y económicamente seguros a menudo evitan el Evangelio, mientras que los pobres y humildes lo abrazan con entusiasmo.

En el sacramento de la Eucaristía, Dios invita a todos a saborear su gran amor. Al participar en la liturgia de la Eucaristía, Dios aumenta nuestro deseo y disposición para el banquete celestial que está por venir. ¿Cómo responderemos a la invitación del Señor al banquete de bodas de su Hijo? ¿Estaremos demasiado preocupados por los asuntos mundanos para aceptarlos con humildad? ¿O responderemos con corazones rebosantes de amor y gratitud por el don del refrigerio del Señor y la oportunidad de vivir en su casa para siempre?

Jesús dijo: Muchos son los llamados, pero pocos los elegidos. El rey rechazó al hombre mal vestido porque no consideró su invitación como un gran honor. Por consiguiente, no se molestó en vestirse con la nueva naturaleza, creada a semejanza de Dios en la verdadera justicia de Dios. Los invitados que estaban vestidos con ropas de boda reconocieron la abundante misericordia y el amor de Dios como la única fuente de fortaleza y esperanza, por lo que se vistieron con su misericordia.

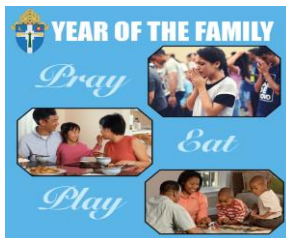

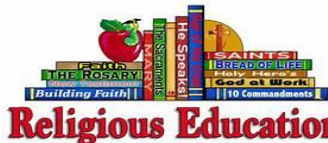
