FROM MSGR. GENE

As you know, beginning next Sunday, February 21, the obligation to celebrate Sunday Mass is being reestablished in our Diocese. The best we can give to God in this world is what He Himself gave us, His Body and Blood in the Eucharistic Sacrifice initiated at the Last Supper. So, to come to Sunday Mass every week is the very best way we can be holy as the Lord Himself is holy. We will begin utilizing some liturgical ministers (i.e., Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion when needed, altar servers), as well as using all the pews in the church. For those who still prefer a little more space when coming to Mass, we will continue to have the video running during Mass and you can view from the basement (Menoken) or parish hall (Wilton). If you desire to wear a face mask when coming to church, please do so. We will also begin enjoying fellowship or other gatherings – always, though, following “smart” health and hygienic guidelines.

ASH WEDNESDAY MASS & ASHES FEBRUARY 17, 7pm



This year, because of the pandemic, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments has directed that the distribution of ashes be done differently than how we are accustomed to receiving them. The priest will say the prayer for blessing the ashes, will say the formula (either “Repent and believe in the Gospel” or “Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return”) only once for all present, then will invite all present to come forward (like at communion) and he will sprinkle ashes on the bowed head of each one. This, actually, has been the common practice in Rome and other places.

LENTEN REGULATIONS



Catholics must fast and abstain on Ash Wednesday, Wednesday, February 17, 2021, and Good Friday, April 2, 2021. All Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence. Fasting (one full meal or two smaller meals but not equal to a full meal) is required from age 18 until age 59; abstinence (from meat) is for those age 14 and onwards.
