November: The Month to Pray For All Souls

Since, about the 900's, the Church has dedicated the month of November as a month in which to pray for those who have gone before us, especially focusing on those souls who are in Purgatory.

While we believe in Heaven and Hell, we also know that in order to enter Heaven it is necessary to be purified of all of those things that may impede us from loving God as completely and as fully as we are called to love Him, because, as we hear in Revelation 21:27, nothing unclean can enter Heaven.

Purgatory it is not, as some think, a "second chance" after death, but, rather, a process of purification for those who have died, as the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* says in "God's grace and friendship, but are still imperfectly purified." (CCC 1030) It is, as the *Baltimore Catechism* calls it: "God's Hospital."

It is dedicated for souls who, though will eventually go to Heaven, have not yet reached its heights and, as a result, are unable to pray for themselves. The Church, therefore, reminds us of the importance of praying for these souls, so that, indeed, we can assist them to their and our Heavenly homeland.

And, by praying for these souls, we are fulfilling one of the spiritual works of mercy, that is, praying for those who are part of the Mystical Body of Christ, a Body that extends beyond life and death, a Body that was made whole by the Resurrection of Christ, a Body that benefits from every single prayer we utter to every single Mass we have offered on their behalf.

That is why St. Gertrude the Great, a saint and mystic of the 13th century, and one whom we will celebrate soon, spent the majority of her life in prayer and study, something that happened after she began to have a series of visions. It is said, that as a result of those visions she began to also have a greater devotion to praying for the souls in Purgatory. In fact, one time when Jesus appeared to her, He told her that each time she said a certain prayer that He revealed to her, 1,000 souls would be freed from Purgatory and that the prayer could even be used for the most hardened of sinners.

The following is that prayer, a prayer that I would invite all of us to say often throughout this month and beyond, knowing how many souls are in need of our prayers, and knowing that God has given us the ability to help them in their need.

"Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Most Precious Blood of Thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen."

Hospitals are required to observe confidentiality and privacy laws and are no longer able to inform parishes of admissions of parishioners. It is now necessary for either the patient, him/her self, or a family member to notify the parish of his/her hospitalization. Arrangements then can be made for the parish priest to visit the patient.

Because of privacy laws we do not publish the names of the sick in our bulletin or announce them at Mass unless the patient or a family member gives us permission to do so.
