Remember Annunciation Parish in Your Will

In honor of the upcoming month of May, one of two months devoted to Mary and Marian devotions, the question may arise as to why those two particular months are dedicated to Mary.

Why are the months of May and October devoted to Mary?

The month of May is and was always seen as the month that marked the beginning of Spring, a season of new life. It is also the month in which we celebrate Mother's Day, the one woman in our lives who gives us life. Given this, as far back as Ancient Greece and Rome, there would be celebrations to mark the occasion. In fact, according to the *Dictionary of Liturgical Feasts*: "Ancient Celts and Romans held spring festivals on the first of May. The custom of crowning a May queen was borrowed from the Roman festival of Flora, the goddess of spring. To counteract those leftover pagan ways, the Church began to celebrate May as the month of Mary, the mother of God. Therefore, as this *Dictionary* points out, "we honor Mary in Eastertime because she is the image of the Church." And, during this month, "she is crowned *regina coeli*, the queen of heaven." What's more, is that in 1965, Pope Paul VI, asked prayers during the month of May in his encyclical *Mense Maio*, dedicating and pleading on Mary's behalf for safety and peace. As he puts it: "Because the month of May is a powerful incentive to more frequent and fervent prayers, and because our petitions more readily find access to her compassionate heart during it, it has been a favorite custom of our predecessors to choose this month, dedicated to Mary, for urging the Christian people to offer up public prayers whenever the needs of the Church demanded it or some grave crisis threatened the human race." Given this, we celebrate Mary in a special way during the month of May and, in fact, will be offering a Rosary procession after Mass on the 4 Saturdays in May.

The reason we honor Mary in October is because it is during that month when we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, and, in fact, the entire month is dedicated in a special way to devotion to the Most Holy Rosary. The reason is as a result of Pope Pius V who, on the anniversary of a naval victory won by a Christian fleet on October 7, 1571 established the feast in 1573 as a means of thanksgiving for the victory of the Christians over the Turkish people, which was directly attributed to the praying of the rosary. Pope Clement XI, however, made it a universal feast of the entire Church in 1716.

Given this, we have been given the great means to honor Mary with the Rosary which extends even beyond the Rosary itself to the reason for the Rosary in the first place, Mary, our Mother and queen.

And, while those two particular months have such significance in the Church's life with relation to Mary, every day we can venerate her in some special way.

In fact, we might imitate Mary's cousin Elizabeth, when Mary went to visit her. Her immediate response, to seeing Mary was: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb! And why is this granted me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" Would that we have the same words of astonishment and humility, knowing, ultimately, that when the mother of our Lord should come to us, she will always bring us to her Son which is why, as St. Louis De Montfort would remind, we can never love Mary too much, no matter the day, time, season or month.
