

Remember Annunciation Parish in Your Will

Our Lady of Fatima

This past week we celebrated the feast of one of Our Lady of Fatima, one of the most famous Marian apparitions of the Church.

It is said, that beginning on May 13, 1917, a series of Marian apparitions in a small town in Portugal, known as Fatima started to occur. It began on that day but would continue on the 13th day of six consecutive months. It is believed that Mary appeared to three shepherd children, Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco, which began a series of intense visions.

The overarching message from these visions, however, was to pray the Rosary for peace in the world, for an end to WWI, for the conversion of sinners and the conversion of Russia. Attached to this message were three secrets revealed only to them, the first underscoring the importance of devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, the second, a brutal and eye opening vision of Hell, and the third (which is still subject to controversy) the assassination attempt of a bishop in white, of whom many believe and understand as the assassination attempt of St. John Paul II.

Two of the children Jacinta and Francisco died shortly after, but Lucia became a Carmelite nun and died in 2005 at the age of 97. Yet, even to this day their message lives on and there are still elements of the message of Fatima that are still preserved, in fact, the "Oh my Jesus," said after each decade of the Rosary was added as a result of this apparition.

Yet, since it has been seen as one of the most well-known and, for lack of a better word, serious apparitions from Our Lady, it has shown us the great importance, especially in this day and age, of praying the Rosary and working to establish true devotion to Mary which can also help us to center more on the Eucharist itself. In fact, there are some beautiful prayers of reparation that the angels revealed to the children for them to say, one of which being: "'My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love you, and I ask pardon for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love you."

And it almost seems like a cry and a pleading with us, on Mary's behalf, to stay close to her and her Son in the Eucharist; a simple message, to be sure, but timely nonetheless.

Perhaps, then, we might heed her message and, with the same simplicity of those children, pray. For, in the end, that was Mary's strongest and constant message, to pray, or, as she revealed to Francisco, "Pray. Pray. The Hearts of Jesus and Mary have merciful designs upon you." Because, by uniting ourselves to those two hearts, the Sacred and Immaculate Hearts, we enter their very hearts, feeling their pain and loving as they do, so that we are compelled to offer prayers for the world, for conversion, for those who need them and, above all, for reparation of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. That is why one of the angels who appeared to those children has left a

beautiful and powerful Trinitarian prayer that we should all pray:

*MOST Holy Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit,
I adore Thee profoundly.*

*I offer Thee the Most Precious Body, Blood,
Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ,
present in all the tabernacles of the world,
in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges,
and indifference by which He is offended.*

*And through the infinite merit
of His Most Sacred Heart, and the
Immaculate Heart of Mary,*

I beg of Thee the conversion of poor sinners.

Arrangements then can be made for the parish priest to visit the patient.
