Farewell

When we consecrate ourselves to God, whether by Baptism, or, in my case, ordination, life becomes less a series of random moments, and, instead, moments and opportunities of discernment, because, when we give ourselves to God, we are no longer our own, but His and we place ourselves in His hands and allow Him to gently nudge us in the direction in which He wants us to go.

And, while, oftentimes, that means that we have to leave one place in order to go to another, it does not mean that we have left, per se, because we always leave a part of ourselves wherever we are, rather, it means we are following the road that God has laid out for each and every one of us. The disciples did it, the Apostles did it, families do it, everyone does it, it is, whether we like it or not, a way and a part of life.

Yet, while it is natural, in a sense, it is also difficult, because, by our nature, we find we get attached to people and places and we get comfortable where we are and in what we do. As a result, it then becomes that much more painful and challenging when we are called to move on, because in our leaving we don't just leave a part of ourselves we leave the people who helped us become who we are behind as well.

I know it has only been 9 months, but, as you know, I love teaching and being in a classroom, in fact, ever since my ordination I have always wanted to be given an opportunity to teach and, in fact, it is among one of the many things of my priesthood that I always thoroughly enjoyed. When I was newly ordained and assigned to St. Margaret I always looked forward to Tuesday and Wednesday nights, since on Tuesday night I would teach the teenagers apologetics and on Wednesday night I would teach the adults the same.

In my previous parish, as pastor, I offered a few presentations ranging from Angels and Demons, to the History of Lent, to Purgatory and when the Deacon stepped down from the Confirmation program, I took it over, revamped it, and designed it based on the questions the teenagers asked. All of that was mere preparation for the three years I spent in Pope John where I found something that I not only enjoyed but did joyfully. And, I think you noticed that during the Bible Study on the Book of Revelation seeing as you found it very informative and helpful.

Given that, I know for a lot of you, you were not surprised by my announcement, but I also know that you were disappointed, and, though disappointed, at the same time, happy for me. In fact, a parishioner

told me that that was your prayer for me, that I be happy, and, believe it or not, teaching, being in a school, being in a classroom, brings me a lot of joy.

Although, my time here was short, I want to thank everyone for all you have done for me, all you have given me, and all you have taught me, because while I leave I take with me many memories, many experiences and many new skills that, I pray, will help me in my new assignment as teacher and chaplain at Morris Catholic.

Be assured of my constant prayers for you and know that you will not be forgotten. May God bless you and keep you always in the palm of His hand. Farewell, for now, until we meet again.

**Notification of Hospitalization
Illness or Impending Surgery**

Hospitals are required to observe confidentiality and privacy laws and are no longer able to inform parishes of admissions of parishioners. It is now necessary for either the patient, him/her self, or a family member to notify the parish of his/her hospitalization. Arrangements then can be made for the parish priest to visit the patient.

Because of privacy laws we do not publish the names of the sick in our bulletin or announce them at Mass unless the patient or a family member gives us permission to do so.
