A Reflection From Fr. Ricardo

This account presents the attitude of both sisters: Mary sitting down at Jesus' feet is all taken up listening to His Word and Martha, instead, is taken up completely by many services and she gets close to Jesus to protest about her sister's behavior.

Martha begins with a rhetorical question, "Lord, do You not care that my sister is leaving me to do the serving all by myself?" "Tell her to help me". "Martha, Martha"... Jesus answers in an affectionate tone; this is the sense of the repetition of the name. Jesus reminds her that she is concerned about "many things", and in reality she needs "only one"

Today's Gospel presents two different personalities. Martha, is all taken up by "many things" and Mary; does not do even one, she is all taken up with listening to the Master. The purpose of this contrast is to underline the attitude of Mary who dedicates herself to listen fully and totally to the Master, thus becoming the model for every believer.

Martha: She is the one who takes the initiative to receive Jesus in her house. In dedicating herself to receive the Master she is full of anxiety for the multiplicity of things to be prepared and by the tension of seeing herself alone to do it all. She is taken up by so much work, she is anxious, and experiences a great tension. Jesus does not disapprove of Martha's work, the value of acceptance and welcoming concerning His person, but He warns the woman about the dangers into which she may fall: anxiety and agitation. Jesus had already said something about these risks: "Seek first the Kingdom of Heaven, and everything else will be given to you as well".

Mary: She is the one who accepts the Word, she was listening". Mary's attitude is in contrast with her sister's anxiety and tension. Jesus says that Mary has preferred "the best part" that corresponds to listening to His Word. This attitude does not endorse avoiding one's own tasks or daily responsibilities, but only the knowledge that listening to the Word precedes every service, every activity.

The Gospel's teaching this week is balance between action and contemplation. It is not a question of dividing the day in times dedicated to prayer and others to service, but attention to the Word precedes and accompanies the service. The desire to listen to God cannot be replaced by other activity: it is necessary to dedicate a certain time and place to seek the Lord. The commitment to cultivate listening to the Word comes from the attention to God: everything can contribute: the environment of the place, the time. However, the desire to encounter God should come from within one's own heart. There is no technical element which automatically leads one to encounter God. It is a problem of love: it is necessary to listen to Jesus, to be with Him, and then the gift is communicated, and falling in love begins. The balance between listening and service involves all believers, in family life as well as in professional and social life: What can we do so that baptized persons persevere and attain maturity of faith? We should train ourselves to listen to the Word of God. This is the most difficult but surest way to attain maturity of faith.

Notification of Hospitalization Illness or Impending Surgery

Hospitals are required to observe confidentiality and privacy laws and are no longer able to inform parishes of admissions of parishioners. It is now necessary for either the patient, him/her self, or a family member to notify the parish of his/her hospitalization. Arrangements then can be made for the parish priest to visit the patient.

Because of privacy laws we do not publish the names of the sick in our bulletin or announce them at Mass unless the patient or a family member gives us permission to do so.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be administered upon request prior to a scheduled hospital admission or before any elective surgery. Please call the Parish Office at 973-694-5700. All calls are kept confidential.

MARY AND MARTHA

At some time or other, anyone who has hosted a large group sympathizes with Martha. Worried and burdened, she has been trying to be of service to Jesus and His followers. She is giving her time, her talent, and her gifts.

When she appeals to Jesus for recognition of her efforts and asks for assistance from her sister, we can imagine that the Lord's response gives her a sting of hurt feelings. Those of us who serve our families, our parishes, and communities have all been through a moment or more of feeling unappreciated.

In our gospel, Jesus was on His last trip to Jerusalem. He was on His way to suffer and die. He had paused at Bethany to be together – for the last time – with Mary, Martha, and Lazarus. He had come to be strengthened by their loyal and loving friendship.

Over the past few Sundays, we have seen that Christian service is a requirement. This week we find that we must discover the service needed. We don't get to choose how and what to do for a person in need. We are directed to enter the heart of the person we serve and respond to the real need. Jesus wanted to be heard. Mary listened. Jesus wanted to be joined in prayer. Mary prayed. Martha had chosen her service according to what she saw as necessary. It became a worry and a burden.

Often, we serve with listening and prayer.
