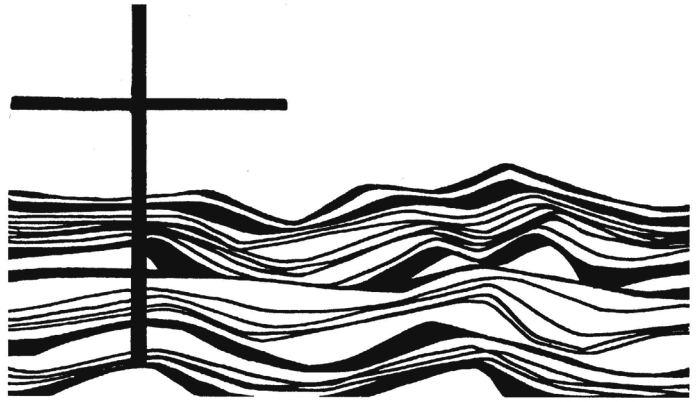

Human Words

Over and over again, Luke's Gospel describes Jesus in private prayer. So, it shouldn't surprise us that His followers not only asked Jesus to create a prayer for their use, but they also wanted to know the way to pray. In today's reading, we are given the "Our Father" as the prayer itself, and in the subsequent parable, we learn how to pray.

In the "Our Father," we are encouraged to speak directly and simply to God as our Father, not our Creator, and not our Judge. A French poet, Charles Peguy, wrote a playful story in which God analyzes the effect of the Incarnation on His point of view. God recalls the effect of Christ's humanity by remembering: **He spoke like them, He spoke with them, He spoke as one of them.** So now, when the Father hears us, He hears His son. God is placed in the position of hearing us as His children.

In the story, the omniscient, omnipotent Creator has come to view us through the eyes of a doting parent of young children. We have all seen tiny, relentless children nag their father, as they demand something they want. Often their presumption and bold persistence is laughable. The children sense that the giant, all-powerful parent is touched by their bold vulnerability. The child receives what he wants only when the father lets him have it. The poet whimsically portrays God as under attack and defenseless against our words.
