Tomorrow

Today's parable shows us the foolishness of making all of our plans on the basis of the here and now. In the story, the rich man stores up treasure for himself. He is greedy. The Greeks had a word for greed that made clear that it is more than just a desire for money. The word is *pleonexia*. People with *pleonexia* experience a restlessness that pushes them to acquire more and more. They never see beyond themselves. Their planning is aggressively self-centered.

The rich man had an abundance of riches which he never considered giving away. As Christians, we should understand that this is the reverse of the Christian message. Our mission is to store up treasure in heaven. For a Christian, this is wealth management. Storing our lives with what matters to God.

There is a story of a conversation between an ambitious young man and an older and wiser friend who knew what matters to God. The younger man announced: *I will learn my trade perfectly.* His friend inquired: *And then? I will set up a business. And then? I will make a fortune. And then? I suppose that I will grow old and retire and live a happy retirement. And then? Well, I guess that someday I will die. And then?*

My daughter, Gianna Matthews, has been through Proton Therapy (radiation) and Chemo, along with several surgeries over the past year. This month we are one (1) year out from being diagnosed with brain cancer. Gianna continues on the path to recovery. She has been through 8 weeks of intense therapy at Children's Specialized Hospital. She is still on a feeding tube and cannot talk. She is still not walking. However, she is making progress!! In her Physical Therapy, they are working her standing upright using a special standing chair. Her legs are being straightened and are getting stronger. She has actually walked 30 feet in this stander on her tippy toes, which is not a big deal. They can help with the tippy toes. Eating is still a huge challenge. She has no desire. It's been a work in progress. She tried chocolate pudding and whipped cream, but she is having a hard time swallowing. The Doctor's say eating and talking will be the last to come back.
