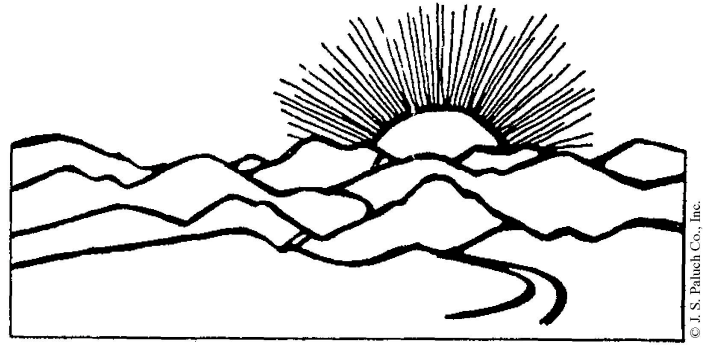

Vacant Seat

Vacant Sede (Latin for the seat being vacant) is a term for the state of an Episcopal see while without a bishop. In the canon law of the Catholic Church, the term is used to refer to the vacancy of any seat of a particular church. The custom is to place an umbrella next to the Presidential Seat of the Bishop. When the umbrella is open the Seat is occupied, and when it is closed that means the seat is unoccupied. Our beautiful Music Ministry has been under the magnificent direction of Mr. Steven Pierinelli for some time. We are so grateful to him. Starting this past weekend, the Music umbrella has been closed. In September, our new Director of the Ministry of Music will take office. Her name is Irina K. Robinson. Ms. Robinson is a professional musician and a humble Christian. She understands that liturgical music is about Jesus Christ and His Church. She understands that the role of music is art but even more, Sacred Art, at the service of evangelization. With a Bachelor's Degree in Conducting Choirs and a Master's Degree in Music Education (both from The College of Arts and Genesis Russian Academy of Music in Moscow), Irina has served in different parishes such as St. Anastasia Parish in Teaneck, SS. Joseph and Michael Parishes in Union City, and Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Jersey City. All of them in the Archdiocese of Newark. She has also served as a substitute in our Diocese, in Our Lady Queen of Peace Parish, in Branchville, NJ. After having evaluated seven application submissions in consultation with Mr. Pierinelli, I have appointed Ms. Robinson as Director of Music Ministry. Both Ms. Robinson and I agree on the importance of music as an enhancement of worship and an important form of prayer. We have also agreed that we will get to know one another and the needs of our parish a little bit more before September, when we plan to open the umbrella and officially call the Music Seat occupied. Please pray with me and ask Our Lord and Saint Cecilia, Patroness of Music, that everything is according to the Will of God and the good of our Annunciation community. Fr. Ricardo Ortega

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION

Holy Hour or Eucharistic Adoration is the Roman Catholic devotional tradition of spending an hour or more in Eucharistic adoration in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

In 1673 St. Margaret Mary Alacoque stated that she had a vision of Jesus in which she was instructed to spend an hour every Thursday night to meditate on the sufferings of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. This practice later became widespread among Catholics.

Annunciation Parish will hold Eucharistic Adoration every Wednesday during the year beginning on Wed., Sept. 18, 2019. This time of prayer is open to all parishioners/Christians who want to be alone and in private with Our Lord Jesus Christ in his real Presence in the Most Holy Eucharist. The schedule will be as follows:

- 7:30 a.m. Morning Mass
- 9:00 a.m. The Lord will be exposed to be adored
- 11:50 a.m. A discreet reposition to the Lord will be taken beginning in October when 12:05 Mass resumes. Exposition of the Lord will follow the 12:05 Mass.

- 4:00 p.m. Reposition and Benediction
