Remember Annunciation Parish in Your Will

Reflection by Fr. Ricardo Ortega

Today's readings insist that "what everyone knows" is wrong in the eyes of God. Everyone knows *how the world works*; it's common sense. Everyone knows that *the way to get ahead* is to be assertive, even aggressive. Everyone knows that *doing favors* for the important and powerful will insure favors in return. Everyone knows that humility is not the way *to network with the right people*.

A lack of humility has become a serious deprivation in modern culture. We have bought into the "Me-first" attitude and the idea that things are "beneath our dignity". This happens in the home, at work, and even in the parish community.

We all know the story of George Washington and the cherry tree incident. He refused to tell a lie to avoid punishment. In the military annals of the American Revolution there is a story of a group of new recruits struggling to repair a break in a rampart. The work was too heavy, but the corporal in charge kept shouting instructions but refusing to help. A passerby in civilian clothes dismounted from his horse and pitched in. The stranger asked the corporal why he hadn't helped. The corporal believed that his superior rank precluded heavy labor. At that point, George Washington identified himself as the commander-in-chief. Washington is always depicted as truthful and humble. Humility and truth go together. A great saint said that *Humility is truth*. Today, we are invited to take a close look at ourselves. We will be humbled, and that's good.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION

Holy Hour or Eucharistic Adoration is the Roman Catholic devotional tradition of spending an hour or more in Eucharistic adoration in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

In 1673 St. Margaret Mary Alacoque stated that she had a vision of Jesus in which she was instructed to spend an hour every Thursday night to meditate on the sufferings of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. This practice later became widespread among Catholics.

Annunciation Parish will hold Eucharistic Adoration every Wednesday during the year beginning on Wed., Sept. 18, 2019. This time of prayer is open to all parishioners/Christians who want to be alone and in private with Our Lord Jesus Christ in his real Presence in the Most Holy Eucharist. 9:00 a.m. The Lord will be exposed to be adored
