Reflection by Fr. Ricardo

Today's gospel contains an analogy that challenges us to spend time considering its meaning. All of the story's characters have sinister personalities. While a steward is given the responsibility of maintaining and expanding the wealth of the owner, this cunning steward has expanded and assured his own future by benefitting others who have cheated the owner of his property. Ironically, the master appreciates the ingenuity of the crooked steward, who through "cooking the books" has depleted the master's goods and reduced the debts of others.

This worldly-wise steward takes care of himself and others just as unworthy as he. He is protecting himself by helping others. He assures his future by giving the Master's goods away.

Saint Ambrose believed that Jesus was demonstrating that we need to pay as much attention to our souls as to our worldly business. The business of our souls is to use and distribute the graces we have. We know that "you can't take it with you" when we leave this world, but what we do leave behind us can benefit us in the next world. Jesus is contrasting stewardship and possession in this world and stewardship and goodness in the spiritual realm.

Christians are stewards of what is not ours. We are responsible for maintaining and sharing all of God's boundless goodness that we can. We are responsible for sharing that goodness with others.
