The Sin of Never Noticing

In ancient Israel, there were no eating utensils. People ate with their hands and chunks of bread were served as napkins. Guests would wipe their hands and then throw the bread on the floor. This bread was the “crumbs falling on the floor” which Lazarus ate while being pestered by dogs.

Lazarus is the one named character in the parable. His name means **God is my help**. Traditionally, we have referred to the rich man as **Dives**. In Latin, it means **rich man**. Dives is extraordinarily wealthy. He feasts and dresses elegantly every day. His life is superbly luxurious. He never works. He is a figure of indolence and self-indulgence. In the next world, he is condemned to torment. Is his sin being rich?

Dives did not order Lazarus cast out of his house. He did not refuse him the crumbs of bread. He was not abusive or cruel to the beggar. Dives committed the sin of complacency. He never noticed Lazarus nor his desperate condition. He was unmoved by the human suffering right in front of him.

When we look at the world’s suffering and feel no grief or pity, we are ignoring the teachings of Jesus. Sorrow must be comforted, needs must be supplied, pain must be relieved. **Attention must be paid.**

On our last day, we will not be asked: **How much did you have?** We will be asked: **How much did you care?**
