Reflection by Fr. Ricardo

Each week, I have been writing a short reflection on the readings of that particular Sunday. This reflection and the homily are my responsibility in sharing the biblical portion of what we call the Deposit of Faith with you. I have been so grateful when individuals have stopped to comment on one of my thoughts and share their response.

Important data from the Deposit of Faith is not contained in the Scriptures. It is the role of the bishops and the pope, and the councils and writings to expand our understanding. Recently, I attended a convocation of all the priests of the Pater-son Diocese with our Bishop Serratelli. It was a spiritually important encounter for all of us. The program included a presentation by Fr. Jerry McGlone, SJ of Georgetown University. Fr. Jerry spoke on the priestly love that we priests should have for one another. It is this love that bolsters and fortifies our commitment to our vocation in these difficult times. It was titled *Love One Another as the Lord Loves*. It was brilliant, sincere, and so helpful.

The second part of the program was Bishop Serratelli's sharing of a Pastoral Letter on the value of Christian Marriage. The entire program was beautifully designed and infused with hope. For the next few weeks, it is my intention to publish a portion of Bishop Serratelli's Pastoral Letter on Marriage. It is the work of a true scholar and a fine writer. I found it to be a blessed encounter. I pray that you do too.

One of the greatest paintings displayed in the Louvre is Veronese's Wedding Feast at Cana. The artist depicts the first miracle of Jesus at the wedding of Cana in the midst of a sumptuous feast of food and music. Veronese's vivacious style brilliantly joins the Biblical event and the contemporary. The artist places Christ at the very center of a lavish wedding feast of 16th century Venice, because Christ is at the center of every Christian marriage. To be continued next week.

2019 Bishop's Annual Appeal

While there are many ways to donate to the Annual Appeal, there is one option unique to people who are 70 1/2 or over and have an IRA. If you are in this category, the IRS requires you to take a required minimum distribution from your IRA each year. As a result, this distribution is added to your taxable income and increases the amount of taxes owed to the government. However, instead of taking your required minimum distribution, you can instruct your IRA investment manager to donate this distribution to a charity such as the Bishop's Annual Appeal and this automatically omits this amount from your adjusted gross income. This tax benefit can be realized by all qualifying individuals, whether you take the standard deduction or itemize your deductions. This can be a significant benefit to you and a great way to support the work of the Bishop's Annual Appeal. You will get an email with a verification link to finish setting up your account. If you do not see the email, check your spam folder.
