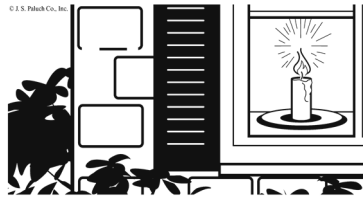

## From the Desk of Fr. Rcardo

### The Divine Plan for Salvation

The word *vocation* usually brings to mind a special call to the consecrated life of a religious or a priest. It has the connotation of a decisive giving of one's life to the service of God. Today's gospel highlights several individuals who experienced definite calls in the middle of their mundane workdays: Peter, Andrew, James and John, ordinary people.

Jesus had begun His role in Salvation History by becoming incarnate, by living the life of a dutiful child, and by learning and working at a trade. The human routine. He went to the Jordan and was baptized by John taking on the sinfulness of the world. He went into the desert to pray and fast and encounter His adversary, the Evil One. And then, He began to call people: Vocations.

God, who is utterly self-sufficient created companions for Himself. He called them by name. His first strategy for saving the world was to gather a group of people to work with Him to preach and to cure *every disease and illness among the people*. He began to form the Church. The Church was born at Pentecost, but it had its inception on the shores of Galilee. At our baptism, we are called by name, like Peter and Andrew, to act as Jesus acted, in our time, around all places, and even the no-places of our world. **We are Church;** we are His working companions. He calls. Do we accept, just like James and John?
