sacramental life

Baptism

To have a child baptized, you must register and attend a class as a couple (unless attendance just isn't possible, in which case some discussion with Kathy Kehnast will be necessary). Sessions are held quarterly for both parishes. Try to attend before the child is born. Next session will be in January. If you are expecting or have a new born or somehow haven't gotten around to having an older child baptized, call Kathy to make plans now.

Please don't ask if you "have to go." This is an opportunity to meet with parents of children about the same age as your little one; those parents are in the same wonderful boat as you are.

At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic. Both godparents need to be practicing Catholics. If you don't attend Sunday Mass regularly (a major component of being a practicing Catholic!), there is something you can do about it: Start coming to Sunday Mass.

Penance

The priest is available for Penance

- at St Bernadette Saturdays at 3 PM and Thursdays at 5:30 PM, and
- at St Mary Bremen on Sunday at 8 AM.

Every Catholic priest is available whenever there is a need. There are Penance opportunities for parochial school children four times during the year so that they will learn the beauty of frequent confession. The Church's law requires us to receive the sacrament of Penance at least once a year.

Anointing and Care of the Sick

We receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick when dangerously ill, facing major surgery, or suffering from the ravages of old age. We celebrate the sacrament communally at a Sunday Mass before Advent and during the Easter season so that we can all pray with you for "health of mind and body."

We bring Penance, Anointing, and Holy Communion to the sick or shut in. It is very helpful to call the parish office to let us know before a hospitalization or when it has been too long since the sacraments were last available.

Holy Matrimony

Couples wishing to marry should contact the parish office six months before they wish to celebrate the sacrament. Why so long? Because this sacrament, not just the ceremony, requires serious preparation. And the Church needs to be involved in that preparation. Remember, Catholics who marry outside the Church have left the sacramental life and need to change that situation before receiving the other sacraments.

The Church wishes to support couples through the years of their married life. That's why our diocese offers programs to enhance married life. To learn about these programs, watch the weekly bulletin.

Representatives

The pastor is still requested to appoint

• two parishioners from each parish to represent their parish on the Fairfield / Hocking / Pickaway County **deanery pastoral council** (DPC)

The DPC meets **bi-monthly** on a Monday evening for about an hour at a different parish each meeting. Parishioners with some experience on parish pastoral council make especially good representatives because they can share and work together on concerns common to all of the parish communities.

The school boards each meet **monthly** in the evening during the school year. They serve to keep communications happening between their own parish and the Catholic schools.

Each rep is a volunteer appointed by the pastor for a fixed term. A school advisory board member need not be a parent or an alum of the school concerned. They help keep the pastor and the corresponding councils in our own **parishes in the loop**. Several of the positions are already staffed, but we always need a "strong bench" of people to help. Let Fr Kessler of your interest.

Packets of offering **envelopes for 2018** are available on the table in the parish hall. If you do not find a packet with your name, take one of the packets without a name on it but with the lowest serial number. Please save your parish that expense by picking up your packet today.

You could also pick up a copy of the book *Joy to the World: How Christ's Coming Changed Everything (and Still Does)* by Scott Hahn. This book is a Christmas gift for parishioners. We have 100 copies which will be available at the main Church doors at Christmas on a first come, first served basis.

Donations to help defray the cost of Christmas flowers can be **given** to the Lord in memory of a loved one. Just put your gift in an envelope with the name of the loved one on the front and drop it in the collection basket in either parish.

A Better Way to Ring in the New Year

You could shout "Happy New Year" from your front porch. You could go to a party or to a bar. You could sit at home and watch television. You could be with family or friends. You could be alone and maudlin. Or you could just go to church and, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, begin the New Year in the happiness of prayer. A few parishioners are going to gather at St Bernadette for an hour of prayer, from 11:30 PM on Dec 31 until 12:30 AM on Jan 1. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed on the main altar. There will be no refreshments, no bells rung, or fireworks exploded. We will not watch our clocks or interrupt prayer to greet each other at the turn of the year. It will just be a quiet hour or so of adoration of the Eucharistic Lord, of atonement for our sins of the preceding year, and of fervent request for peace, prosperity, and renewal of our respect for the holy gift of life in the new year. Church doors will be open shortly before 11:30, and close up again soon after 12:30.

The Festival of Jesus

The festival of Christmas is a birthday without any very important link to the actual date in the year of the birth of Jesus. But that doesn't matter. Because a birthday is seldom really a day to commemorate a person's birth.

I am old enough that I don't know of anyone who has a memory of my being born. When you get to be my age you have a certificate but that's it. Otherwise people have to take your word for it. When a small child has a birthday, her parents often recall the circumstances surrounding that birth. Perhaps the grandparents, some of the aunts and uncles and somewhat older brothers and sisters might share their memories. But no one else is likely to remember the day and the events surrounding it. My Mom and Dad have been dead for a number of years. My older brother was just three when I was born. No grandparents and only a very few other older relatives are left.

So what is there to celebrate in a person's birth-day? It is not any memory of the birth but the person who is being celebrated. That's the way it is for the births of other historic persons. On Washington's or Lincoln's or King's birthday we don't give any thought to the birth of the baby George or Abraham or Martin. We think of—and rejoice in—the accomplishments of the person. Or just the joy of knowing the person, accomplished or not.

So you might think of Christmas as a sort of "Jesus day." He, more than any human person, is surrounded by the telling of the story of his birth, its prediction, his mother's activity during her pregnancy, the impoverished but glorious circumstance of his birth, the remarkable visits of angels, shepherds, and Magi, the presentation of him in the Temple, Herod's attempt to destroy him, the exile, the finding in the Temple after Jesus had run away from home, or we might better say, had gone home to his Father's house.

But, in another sense, our celebration of Jesus on this Jesus day that is Christmas, is a day to reflect on him. Some people want to focus on his teaching about how we all ought to conduct ourselves. But that isn't the primary focus of the Gospels or of the teaching of Christianity. Our Faith isn't so much about "Here's what you must do"—although there is certainly a moral imperative about being a Christian. The primary focus, all the way through the Gospels, the rest of New Testament, and the teaching of the Church is on who is giving that new commandment and by what authority he gives it and what he has come to accomplish for us.

Christmas is **the day to celebrate Jesus**. He is **the word of God became flesh**. That becoming flesh actually occurred at the moment of his conception. The day to commemorate that is March 25th, the day 9 months earlier when Jesus himself was conceived. The as yet unborn John knew that the Incarnation, the becoming flesh of the Word, had already take place before Jesus was even born. That's why he was jumping for joy.

The miracle of his becoming flesh is not the limit of our Christmas joy but its announcement to the world of what has happened and what he is getting ready for, and how great is that love that brings him to us.

What has happened is the seemingly impossible: the Word of God through whom all things were made, the only begotten Son of God, God himself, the second of the three persons of the Holy Trinity that God is, has become one of us. Actually has become flesh. **Pure spirit, without losing his purity of spirit, has humbled himself to share our humanity**.

But this is not the recreation of God who has decided to go slumming in the human condition. That is all the better the pagan imagination could do with the stories of gods visiting the humans. We have something else going on here. He has humbled himself to share in our humanity so that we could come to share in his divinity. I won't become "a god." That is logically impossible. It would be preposterous. But that **I—and you—can share in the divine life, can be adopted into sonship, can become God's own children and not simply his creatures**, well ... that boggles our minds. Of course it is beyond our imagining. But God says that it is not beyond God's imagining. It is what he has in mind for us.

That sharing in divine life is what we celebrate when we celebrate Jesus.

The part of the Letter to the Hebrews which we read on Christmas morning says it beautifully:

In times past, God spoke in partial and various ways to our ancestors through the prophets; in these last days, he has spoken to us through the Son,

whom he made heir of all things and through whom he created the universe,

who is the refulgence of his glory, the very imprint of his being, and who sustains all things by his mighty word.

So does the letter of Paul to the Philippians:

Who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross.

Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth.
