Sacramental Life

Baptism

To have a child baptized, parents must register and attend a class as a couple. Try to attend before your child is born. At least one parent and godparent must be practicing Catholics. Please call or email the church office for information or to register.

Confession

A priest is available for Penance at St. Bernadette on Saturdays at 8:30 AM and 3 PM, and on Thursdays at 5:30 PM. Confessions are offered Sundays at St. Mary Bremen at 8 AM. Every Catholic priest is available whenever needed.

Anointing and Care of the Sick

The priest gives the Anointing of the Sick to one who is dangerously ill, facing major surgery, or suffering from the ravages of old age. Call the parish office to inform us if a loved one is in need of pastoral care in sickness, particularly with an extended absence from attending Mass.

Holy Matrimony

Couples wishing to marry should contact the parish office six months before a wedding. Why so long? Because this Sacrament, not just the ceremony, requires serious preparation. And the Church needs to be involved in that preparation. The Church needs to support couples through the years of married life and offers programs to enhance married life. Looking Ahead: Mass Schedule

Next week, Sunday through Wednesday, October 27 through October 30, Masses are scheduled as usual. But then comes All Saints' Day, on Friday, November 1, which is a holy day of obligation (and First Friday as well, which is the Church's special monthly day to honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus) and All Souls' Day on Saturday, November 2, which is not obligatory, but on which priests and congregations are urged to make a special effort to attend Mass (and First Saturday as well, which is the monthly special day of the Blessed Virgin Mary).

On Thursday, October 31, we will celebrate the Vigil of the Holy Day Mass

- at 6 PM at St. Bernadette.

On Friday, November 1, we will celebrate Holy Day Masses

- at 8:20 am at St. Bernadette, and
- at NOON at St. Mary Bremen.

On this First Friday we will also have our usual devotions to the Sacred Heart.

On Saturday morning, November 2, we will celebrate First Saturday Mass

- at 9 AM (as usual) with a Latin Mass at St. Bernadette and
- at NOON with a Latin Mass at Sacred Heart Cemetery (we will gather at the Church if the weather doesn't permit)
- on Saturday evening, Mass will be at the usual time of 4 PM at St. Bernadette, but with the parish's tradition of beginning the Month of the Faithful Departed with a Mass of Remembrance, commemorating at Mass parishioners who have died during the preceding year. Be sure to fulfill your duty, and try to add these other special events. There is something special about going to Mass even when it isn't strictly required.

Cemetery Sunday

Cemetery Sunday is a time of prayer for our beloved dead which is observed on the first Sunday of November. This year prayers will be offered

- at **St. Mary Cemetery** in Lancaster on Sunday, November 3, at 1:30 PM (weather permitting)
- at **Sacred Heart Cemetery** (near Bremen) on Sunday, November 3, at 1 PM (if weather doesn't permit, we will gather at the church instead). All are welcome to both. In both

cemeteries, artificial flowers, including stone top arrangements, are permitted from November 1 until March 1. Thank you for your cooperation and for helping keep our cemeteries places of respect and Resurrection faith.
