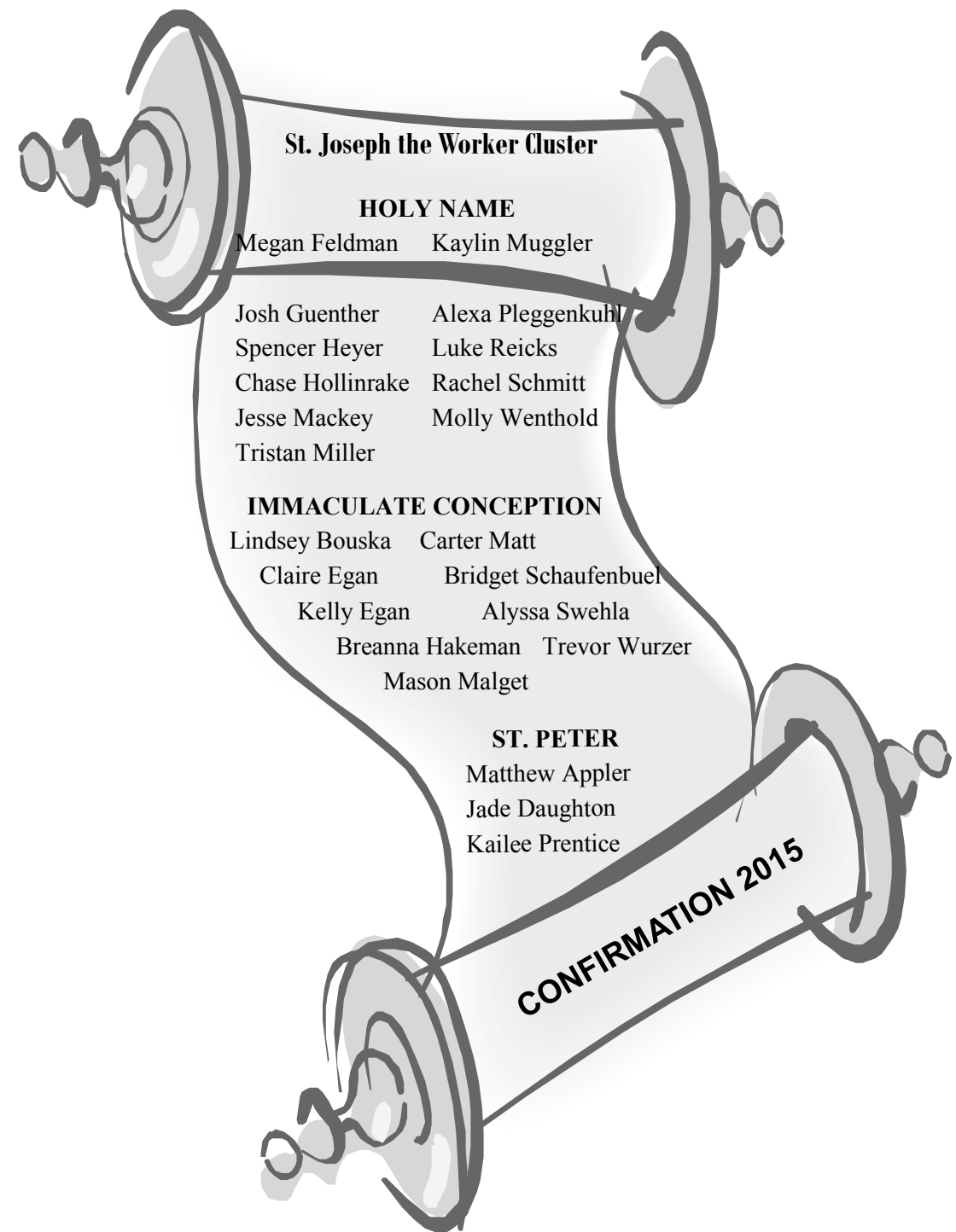

At its September meeting, the APC reviewed and discussed Pope Paul VI's Encyclical *Humanae Vitae*, (On Human Life). The encyclical addresses "responsible parenthood" in the midst of modern society. Through small and large group discussion, the council made recommendations on how the teachings of *Humanae Vitae* can be known, understood, and lived by Catholics today.
