A note from Fr. Abuchi

"Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof..."

Sunday, July 17, 2016 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The 'roof' part really bothers some Catholics. "I don't have a roof," said some of us. "I'm a person, not a house with a roof." The roof imagery is taken from the account of the centurion that is found in the Gospels of both Matthew and Luke, who asks Jesus to only say the word to heal his gravely ill servant, even as he acknowledges that he is not worthy to invite Jesus into his home, "under his roof".

In many ways, the centurion recognizes that a special power is at work in Jesus of Nazareth. Since so much of the Lord's public ministry took place in the area around Capernaum, it is most likely that the centurion saw Jesus and heard him speak on various occasions. Probably he witnessed some of the incredible miracles that Jesus performed there. "In light of the evidence, the centurion draws the only logical conclusion: Jesus commands with divine power." Thus, he believes Jesus could easily cure his ailing servant by only power of His words.

Believing this as well, we must have confidence in the Lord who makes it easy for us to approach Him. He invites us into His house, and offers us the divine food of His Body and Blood. However like Centurion none of us is worthy to receive him. Nevertheless, we should strive to make ourselves more worthy, especially by getting rid of any serious sins (through sacrament of reconciliation) on our hearts before going to Communion.

"Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed" is a small confession, an act of humility, and a prayer for absolution moments before Communion. As we approach that sacred banquet, we do well to imitate the humility and trust of the centurion, in the hope of receiving the healing and wholeness we desire.
