

Have no Anxiety at All!

Is it possible to live a life free from worries and anxieties? Probably not! All of us would like to be free from worries, but sometimes, it seems impossible. We have financial problems, family difficulties, work deadlines, health concerns — and even more so to worry about, what is happening in our country and in our world: natural disasters, societal breakdown, random shootings, political divisions, wars, economic collapse and so forth. But when we analyze our anxieties and worries, we see that they concern only about the past and future and we have no control over either of them.

In today's second reading, St. Paul was in prison but mustered courage to send a beautiful letter to the Philippians community undergoing persecution, encouraging them, "Have no anxiety." Of course, St. Paul is not telling them to ignore the reality but rather he is admonishing them to take a different approach to all the problems and challenges they face daily. And we should do the same. Do not worry or be anxious about the situation you cannot control or have power to change. Don't brood about past faults and blunders, because you can do nothing to change them. However, try to learn from them, to repent of those things which were sinful and to make restitution if possible. The same is true about the future — the things which you worry about often do not come to pass or, when they do happen, they turn out completely different from what you feared. The only day we can control is today but not even entirely. Even Jesus said, "Do not worry about tomorrow. Tomorrow will take care of itself. Sufficient for a day is its own evil" (Mt 6:34). That does not mean that we do not make prudent plans. Careful preparation is part of today's duty. But once we make those plans, put them in the Lord's hands.

St. Paul not only admonishes the Philippians to have no anxiety, he further tells them to make their request and offer everything in petitions and prayers to God. And in as much as they are doing what is right, God will definitely guard and give peace to their hearts. Brothers and sister, as you gather today to celebrate the Eucharist, offer your petitions, and may the Lord of peace and hope cast away all your problems and anxieties and nourish you at the Eucharistic table.
