The Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 11, 2015



October is the month when we remember the dignity of all life. In celebrating Respect Life Month we strive to emulate St. Francis of Assisi who had respect for every human being, for all animals, birds and plants and for the environment. As we respect life however, we call to mind particularly the life of the unborn child who is so dependent on the mother and father's decision to bring their birth to fruition.

Abortion is a mortal sin and any woman who has an abortion commits mortal sin, as does the father who assists in this, the doctor, the nurse and the person who drives the woman to and from the abortion clinic. We pray that all who sin in this way will seek the forgiveness of God and those who are Catholic will go to confession and be reunited with God. We also pray for all responsible for committing capital punishment. The death penalty in the eyes of the Catholic Church is a mortal sin and those who sin in this way also must seek absolution.

Life is a gift from God but a gift that can sometimes be abused because of poverty, lack of education or sheer greed. Each of us must try to see Christ in the other person and treat that person with dignity and the love that each person deserves. If we feel hurt, abused or mistreated by another, we must strive to forgive them and not retort with anger or vengeance. As we look at the news each week we see so much anger. Anger comes from the devil. We must combat that anger and through the love of Christ be compassionate as Christ is compassionate.

News from Rome

First I would like to apologize for not writing last week. I returned from retreat and was thrown into the busyness that is Diaconate Ordination Week. Despite the busyness, it was truly a spectacular sight to see and a wonderful experience to take part in culminating with 39 young men ordained, at St. Peter’s Basilica, to the diaconate, the last step before being ordained a priest. It was truly awesome to see so many ordinandi and all their guests, we filled the entire front all the way to the back of the center transept with seats. The procession must have lasted 15 minutes because of the high number of priests, bishops and cardinals who were in attendance for the ordination. Truly it was awesome. The back of the Basilica was open still for tourism and everyone flocked to the barrier to get a glimpse of what was happening, impressed to see that such a large ordination still occurs. The entire week was so beautiful to help serve in different prayer services and events at the PNAC for the ordinandi’s families and friends.

Going back a week I would like to thank all of you for your tremendous amount of prayer, it really was a beautiful retreat and you were all always a daily intention of mine. Greccio, where the retreat was held, is a beautiful place that is tucked away in the mountains near Rieti, it is also the home of the first live nativity scene, that was started by St. Francis of Assisi, and where St. Bonaventure wrote most of his theological works. I had the opportunity to hike to a small chapel located on the ridge of the mountain and pray, overlooking the valley thinking to myself that I walked on the same trail that St. Francis would have walked on, it truly helps you to connect your prayers to them. Seeing the nativity scenes from all around the world, displayed at the Shrine in Greccio, helps to realize how this humble Saint has affected the entire world, letting us realize the beauty of God in the most simple of things.
