News from Rome

I want to begin by saying that all of my family in France is safe. I ask that you continue to pray for the people of France as they recover from the attacks last week. Also pray for the people of ISIS, this is the hardest part to do, but the most important. After the attacks I saw a video called “a Letter from the People of the Cross to ISIS.” It was a very powerful video with a very strong message (although I caution adults to watch it first before inviting children to view it); we need to invite those who have fallen prey to terror and fake glamour of ISIS to know Jesus. One line in the message is “You die for your god, but our God died for us.” I was very moved by the message since it is important to remember that Jesus died for us.” I was very moved by the message since it is important to remember that Jesus died for us, so that we may live. And that us is not limited, but must be seen as completely universal. So I ask you all, my brothers and sisters in Christ to continue to pray for me as I study here in Rome. I have finally reached the halfway point in my studies and they are going well. We were also blessed to have a day of Recollection last Sunday to take the time to pray and be in silence. It is so essential that prayer be central to our lives, but also we need to place silence in our lives. I invite all of you to take 5 minutes this week to sit in silence, just listening for the voice of God, whose natural tongue is silence. I pray for all of you always.
