Third Sunday of Easter April 10, 2016



For those of you who attended my Masses last weekend I spoke about the movie *Miracles from Heaven*. Certainly during this Easter Season we experience God's supreme miracle – the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. We know that it is through Christ's suffering, death and glorious Resurrection and the way we live our lives

that we gain eternal life. Each of us is called to be a disciple of Christ, an ambassador for Christ; by the way we interact with others. In the movie we see four disciples – the receptionist at the hospital who manages to get an appointment for the little girl; the waitress who befriends the little girl; the airline ticket clerk who gets tickets for the family flight to Boston; and finally the little girl herself who gives her cross to another little girl who is dying and who then receives the courage to let go, let God. The three working people who helped the girl and family in need were just like us, ordinary people but also just like us who share God's love in an extraordinary way.

I was proud and thrilled by the huge amount of money we collected for our special needs children, young people and adults this past Lent. To date we have brought in \$9,243.00. Any additional money we receive we will divide and pass on to our two groups.

Last Wednesday morning Karen Cunningham (Jessica's mom) and I went to bring the checks to P.G. Chambers School where we met the principal and interacted with several of the little children being wheeled in and out of their classrooms. Please see the pictures inside this bulletin. We then made our way to Employment Horizons and met the leadership team there and then had a wonderful tour of the facility. We visited a room where young adults were working hard at simple tasks. Our parishioner Mark, who you see in the photograph, proudly showed me how he cleaned and prepared cables. A young lady proudly showed me how she prepared the Tiffany gift boxes. Another young man was putting new batteries into the remote control we all use for our cable TV. I was amazed to see the director and staff receive and train these special needs young adults to do simple and effective tasks and are paid and supported by many local companies. They also have a cafeteria where young people are trained in simple food prep. When you go to Stop & Shop and Shoprite you will see some of the Horizons young people bagging your groceries. Do say hello!!!

As the uncle of a special needs young adult Conor, who is nineteen, I know how important it is that they be given a task to do and receive a level of gratification of a job well done. Just like us, special needs children, young people and adults need socialization and interests to engage them. Our special needs children and young people are God's gift to us. Our challenge is to open our hearts and minds to enjoy their simplicity of heart and as best we can give support, courage and free time to their parents.

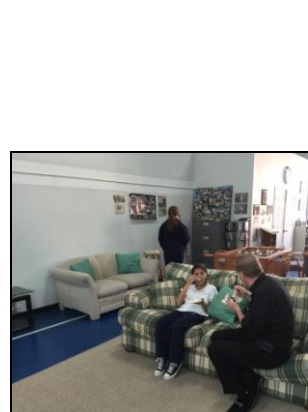

Buona Pasqual! Sorry for not having written in a while, but things were quite hectic here with Easter. We had some beautiful liturgies put together by all the seminarians and faculty in the house. One of the most wonderful experiences for me was visiting the Altars of Repose around Rome. The beauty and attention parishioners put into the decoration of these Altars is breath taking and a wonderful way to enter deeper into prayer. I had the great opportunity to go and visit my godmother and my mother in the north of France, right near the border of Belgium. After spending a few days together she had to go home and work but I had a few days left. I met with three seminarian friends and did a little road trip through Luxembourg, Reims, and Lille. The highlight of the trip was definitely visiting the Cathedral in Reims. This is where the kings of France, were coronated. It is also where Clovis the first Catholic King of France was baptized. This is arguably when France became the eldest daughter of the Church defending her and her interests multiple times.
