# Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 8, 2018

From the Pastor's desk

For those of you who have been to Britain, it is a beautiful country. I'm very fond of Britain and as many of you know, I was born in London and we lived there for the first year of my life. We then moved to Scotland until I was five years old and then moved to Ireland. Britain has had a long turbulent history. During the latter part of the 19<sup>th</sup> century it was said

that "The sun never set on the British Empire." During that era the British Empire encompassed large parts of the world. Britain as you know, became Protestant under the reign of Henry the VIII in the latter part of the 1500's. Henry was married to Catherine of Aragon and wanted the Church to annul the marriage so that he could live with Anne Boleyn. The Vatican refused the annulment and King Henry left the Catholic Church and formed his own church called the Church of England. The Anglican Church throughout the world and the Episcopal Church here is derived from Henry's new concept. He made himself head of the Church of England and to this day the monarch of Britain is still the head of the Church of England.

Henry's renunciation of the Catholic Church of Britain and Ireland caused huge problems for his subjects throughout Britain and Ireland. He and his successor Elizabeth I seized all church lands, properties, institutions and monasteries. He made it illegal to practice the Catholic faith. Bishops and priests were exiled and killed. Any priest caught celebrating Mass, any Catholic caught attending Mass were killed in a vicious and cruel way. To this day the Constitution of Britain prevents a Catholic from being monarch or prime minister.

In the last twenty years many saints and martyrs from Britain and Northern Ireland have been honored by Pope John Paul II, Pope Benedict and Pope Francis. Imagine loving God and your faith so much that you are willing to face imprisonment and a torturous death because you love God more than you love yourself. Margaret Middleton was born in 1553. When she was 5 years of age the Mass was suppressed in England. Her parents joined the Church of England, the new Protestant religion of which the King of England was the head. At 18 years of age Margaret was a lively and beautiful girl and had a great sense of humor. She met John Clitherow, a wealthy butcher and married him. Her husband's brother was a Catholic priest and at age 21 Margaret converted to the Catholic faith. She baptized her children and brought them up in the Catholic faith. Her husband John supported her but did not convert himself. Her non-attendance at Protestant worship soon attracted attention. She was first imprisoned for this at age 24. However, she remained steadfast in her Catholic faith. She started protecting priests and having Mass celebrated in her own home. She built a tiny hidden compartment in her house where a priest could hide. Thanks to her, Mass continued to be celebrated during the time of severe persecution. In March 1586 her house was searched by the authorities. A class was in session. The teacher escaped out the window, her children remained loyal but one neighboring boy revealed the priest's hideout and where his vestments were hidden. Margaret, then expecting her fourth child, was arrested and charged with harboring Catholic priests. Her children and servants were arrested. She never saw them again. She was sentenced to death. Her death was painful. A door was placed over her and rocks placed on the door. She and her unborn baby were crushed to death. Her body was buried secretly. Six weeks later some fellow Catholics found her body and found that it was uncorrupted. Margaret was beautified in 1929 and canonized a saint along with forty other English martyrs in 1970.

Her daughter Anne was placed in the hands of Protestants. Her father got her released and she managed to slip out of England and entered St. Ursula's Convent in Luain. Margaret's sons William and Henry both became priests.

Saint Margaret and the martyrs of England pray for us.
