EASTER MESSAGE 2016

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Joyous and blessed Easter to you!

In this season, which presents to us the very heart of our faith, we certainly have reason to be filled with joy! In the resurrection of Christ, light has overcome darkness, life has overcome death and mercy has overcome sin.

In the resurrection of Christ, light has overcome darkness. On Holy Saturday at the Easter Vigil, the liturgy began with the lighting of the "new fire." The flame of that fire was then used to light the Paschal Candle. From the Paschal Candle the flame was spread to all the people gathered for the celebration. The antiphon sung during the procession was "Christ our Light" and the response, "Thanks be to God!"

This procession brings out the true function of liturgy as sign and symbol. The participants see and even feel the transformation from darkness into light, beginning with the small flame of the new fire and concluding with the illumination of the whole church. This experience of the senses is sign and symbol of the reality that Jesus' resurrection overcomes the darkness of life with light of faith. In the resurrection of Christ, life has overcome death. The prayers of the Church remind us so often, but especially at Easter, that as Jesus was raised from the dead, so shall we also be raised. Yes, Jesus suffered and died, but death was not the end. Rather, he rose to new life, and so shall we. As a prayer from the Easter Sunday Mass tells us, "Through Him the children of light rise to eternal life ... His death is our ransom from death" (Preface II of Easter).


In the resurrection of Christ, mercy has overcome sin. Especially in the Jubilee Year of Mercy, we are called to reflect on this great truth. As Pope Francis said in proclaiming the Year of Mercy, mercy is the bridge that connects us to God and opens our hearts to the hope of being loved forever, despite our sinfulness. Surely, in this Easter Season, we are encouraged to turn to God, knowing with certainty that whatever our sins and failings, they are no obstacle to the power of God's mercy.
