**Defending Our Religious Liberty April 24, 2016**

The government continues to try to fine the Little Sisters of the Poor while exempting plans covering tens of millions of people. One in three Americans does not have a plan covered by this mandate. The government exempted large corporations like Exxon and Pepsi and its own health care plans for military families and the disabled. This means that over 100 million Americans are outside of the mandate. Then, why can't religious organizations be exempt as well?
