### Praise, Worship, and Healing Prayer Service

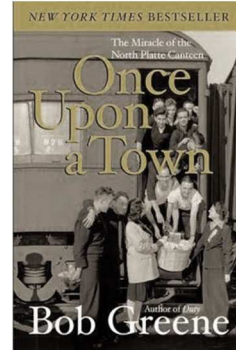
