

Parishioners are invited to learn more about our parish religious education program participation in the Haitian Health Foundation. Over the past few years, our CCD children have raised monies to purchase Happy Houses and goats for the people of Haiti.

With your generous donations, HHP is bringing improved health and well-being to over 250,000 vulnerable people in the greater Jeremie area through healthcare, education, and community development strategies. These important dollars help us to maintain our health facilities, purchase food, medicine, and supplies, ship critical aid items via containers, pay salaries of our Haitian staff (nurses, doctors) and other necessary expenses.

Programs offered to help the HHF:

- ❖ Adopt-a-Village: \$5,000 per village. This gift helps HHF provide mobile medical and dental clinics in a rural mountain village, providing between 2,500 − 3,000 people with improved access to health services.
- Sponsor-a-Student: \$350/school year. School is not free in Haiti, and most children lack access to education, needed to achieve social and economic success. Your gift provides tuition, uniforms, food, medical/dental care, and more.
- Feed-a-Child: \$300 or \$25/month. According to the World Food Program, 100,000 Haitian children under five suffer from acute malnutrition, and 1 in 3 children is stunted, or irreversibly short for their age. Your gifts have been able to reduce the rates of malnutrition in our area by providing food to a child for one year.
- Give-a-Goat: \$150. This gift will provide a pregnant goat to a rural family. It is well known that these animals are hardy and adaptive to any terrain. Recipients of a goat ate taught how to breed, barter, and use the meat as a source of animal protein.
- House Construction Program: Poor housing is associated with a wide range of health conditions, including respiratory infections, asthma, injuries, and mental health. Your gift will replace a hovel of rusted metal, thatch, and scrap wood with a cement house and tin roof. There are two ways that you can support this:
- 1. Happy House: \$1,250. This is the basic cement and tin roof house a life-changing gift to an impoverished family. 2. 2. Happier House: \$1,950. This is the basic Happy House with a micro-flush toilet, lighting powered by a solar panel, and a slightly angled roof to collect rain water into a 55 gallon drum, to then be run through a simple filtration system.
- Save-a-Family: \$300/year. For over 20 years, this program has helped stabilize the most impoverished families. Your gift of \$25/month will assist these families with expenses such as shelter, food, school tuition, and healthcare.
- Micro-flush Toilet: \$325. This composting toilet is sustainable, low cost, environmentally friendly, and odor and fly free. The solids are composted in an aerobic process enhanced by earthworms. Every 2 years, the rear cover is removed so that the rich compost can be used for gardens.
- Micro-lending Program: Promoting financial self-sufficiency and empowerment is one of HHF's objectives. Your gift to this program provides loans to community members, especially women, as well as training in micro-enterprise business skills.
- Powdered Milk: \$125. Children who are 7 and 8 months old receive Gallia milk, which is designed for babies this age to carefully transition them to cow's milk. Children from 9 months receive whole milk powder and iron once a month until one year of age, unless the child is still malnourished.
- Solar Light Kit: \$75. Most families have no electricity in their homes, and your gift will provide a family with a simple system composed of 2 LED lights, a radio, a small solar panel, and a rechargeable battery for the radio. The lighting will help children study in their houses rather than to walk to find a street lamp.
