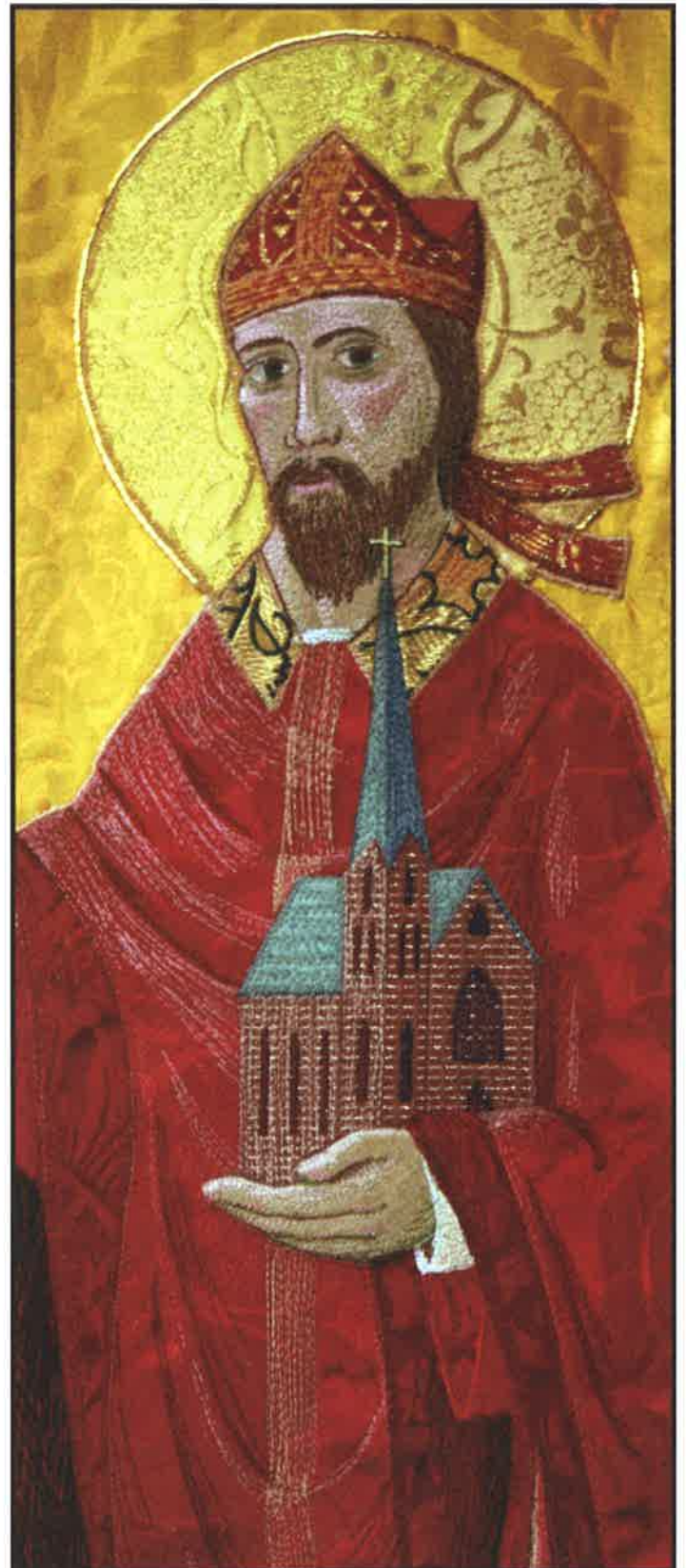

From the Parochial Vicar's Desk...

In 1950 Pope Pius XII promulgated the dogma of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This is something held throughout all times and places in Christianity, but was deemed necessary to declare infallibly and definitively that Our Blessed Mother saw no corruption of the body at the end of her life.

The Second Vatican Council reaffirmed this teaching by stating, "The Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all guilt of original sin, on the completion of her earthly sojourn was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory and exalted by the Lord as queen of the universe, that she might be the more fully conferred to her Son, the Lord of lords (cf. Rev. 19:16) and the conqueror of sin and death." (Lumen Gentium, 59)

Let us entrust ourselves to the protection of Our Lady while on our earthly sojourn, that we too may share in the glory of Lord!

Did You Know... ?????

...The relic of St. Lawrence is placed in our Altar? The relic was from the estate of Monsignor Lawrence Corcoran, a priest of the Diocese of Columbus, who for many years served as President of Catholic Charities USA, an office of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops in Washington D.C. He was also a professor of social work at The Catholic University of America. The relic was given to Father Jan Sullivan from Father Jerome Stluka. It is encased in a sterling silver casket (a gift from Father Jan Sullivan to St. Colman) with the image of Mary and Jesus enthroned and surrounded by saints.

Corresponding to the early days of the Church, it is customary to have a relic of a martyr in the altar. In the early days of the Church, people would gather at the graves of the martyrs on the anniversary of their death to celebrate the date they gave their lives and celebrate the Eucharist. St. Lawrence was tied on top of an iron grill over a slow fire that roasted his flesh little by little, but Lawrence was burning with so much love of God that he almost did not feel the flames. In fact, God gave him so much strength and joy that he even joked. "Turn me over," he said to the judge. "I'm done on this side!" And just before he died, he said, "It's cooked enough now." Then he prayed that the city of Rome might be converted to Jesus and that the Catholic Faith might spread all over the world. After that, he went to receive the martyr's reward. Saint Lawrence's feast day is August 10th. (www.catholic.org)

The altar is made of red oak. The top is made of green Connemara marble imported from Ireland.

The altar is a gift of the Garland Family in memory of their parents, Robert and Martha during the restoration of the church in 2010-2011. It was dedicated on June 12, 2011 by Bishop James F. Garland. Bishop Garland is the youngest brother of Bob. The shields around the altar are the shields representing the patron saints of each of the Garland children: Nancy (St. Anne), James, Nicholas, Christopher, Joseph and Stephanie (St. Monica) in addition to the shield of Pope Benedict in the middle front flanked by the shield for Bob (St. Robert Bellarmine) and the shield for Martha and the shield of Bishop Garland in the middle back.

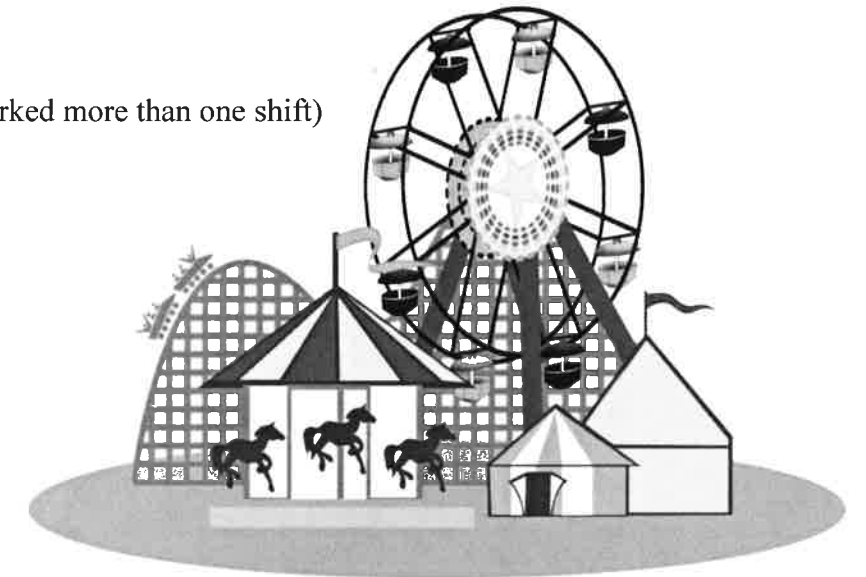
