



September 21: St. Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist, patron of accountants, bankers and bookkeepers

St. Matthew was a tax collector. Jewish tax collectors were shameless crooks who committed the twofold crime of collaborating with heathens and preying upon their own people. "Follow me," Christ said. RECIPE: St. Matthew "PayDay" bars (from catholiccuisine.com)

Ingredients:

1 16 oz. jar dry roasted peanuts 1 can sweetened condensed milk

3 tablespoons butter

2 cups miniature marshmallows

1 (10 oz) bag peanut butter chips

Directions:

Grease the bottom and sides of a 9x13 pan. Pour half of the peanuts into the pan. Over medium low heat, melt butter and chips. Remove from heat and mix in sweetened condensed milk. Stir in marshmallows, do not melt marshmallows. Spoon mixture over peanuts in pan, pat down. Top with remaining peanuts and press down to help adhere the top layer of peanuts. Chill until set.

Timely Tips for Tots at Mass:

- -Do sit up front. Little ones can be amazingly attentive at Mass....but they like to **see** what is happening, not just the backs of others.
- -If possible, hold them in your arms until they are 3 years. By then they have learned Mass is a time to be still and to stay in the pew and they have likely learned some responses by being held so close.
- -If they get loud or disruptive while holding, take them to the vestibule or "quieting room" and hold them there until they settle. Yes, sometimes this is the whole of Mass! But with no visuals and no running about, they usually find the pew a better option! Your efforts will help them grow to love the Lord and the Holy Mass!

Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes

September 14: Exultation of the Holy Cross

This feast commemorates the recovery of the Holy Cross of Christ (originally found in the Holy Land by St. Helena) from the Persians and its return to Jerusalem by Emperor Heraclius in the 7th century. Legend has it that the Emperor (in all his fine robes and jewels) could not advance into Jerusalem with the Cross until he humbled himself, put on penitential clothes and proceeded as a barefoot pilgrim. This Feast is a twofold reminder that: 1) we, as followers of Christ Crucified, must also take up our crosses daily and 2) Jesus triumphed over death and draws us to himself (see John 12:32). Our L

It is said that the hill where St. Helen found the cross was covered with sweet basil. That makes this easy meatless recipe perfect for this feast.

RECIPE: Basil Pesto Pasta with Tomatoes (serves 4-6)

Ingredients:

1 6 oz jar of pesto

1 16 oz box pasta of choice2 cups cherry tomatoes, halved 1/c cup grated parmesan cheese salt and pepper to taste

Directions:

Cook pasta according to package directions, drain and return to pot. Gently stir in pesto. Place pasta on serving dishes and garnish with fresh tomatoes and grated parmesan. Serve with a loaf of crusty bread.


