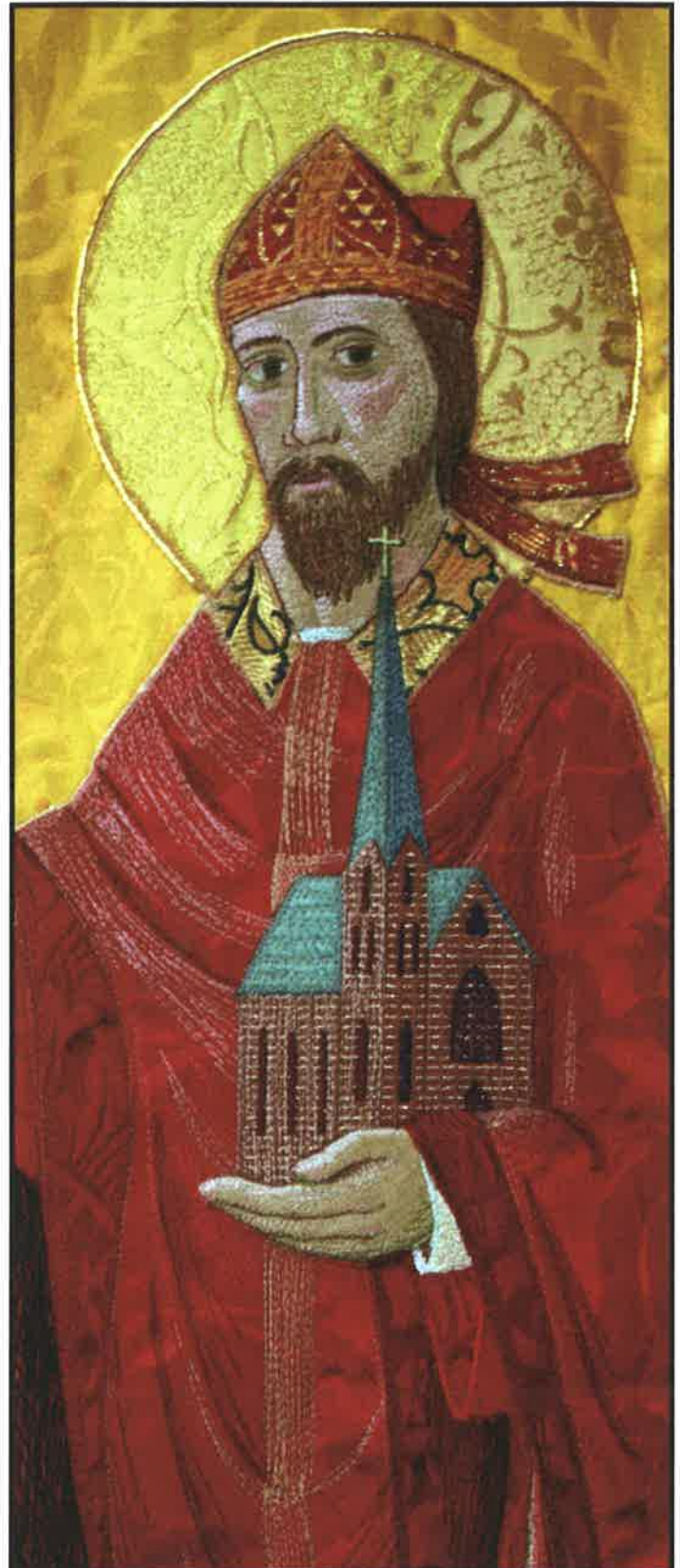

From the Pastor's Desk...

This week is National Vocational Awareness Week. God is calling many young men and women to serve him as priests and religious in our time, but we need to help them to hear the call.

How can we help? By praying for those who have a call. Pray that they might have the wisdom to hear the call and the courage to follow it no matter what the obstacles. The time of Adoration after the Tuesday Mass this week will be specifically marked with an intention for vocations. Consider stopping in and offering some prayer time for vocations.

Also, from time to time the diocese and various religious orders have special events to help young people discern their vocation. You might think of encouraging young people whom you think may have a calling to go to these events.

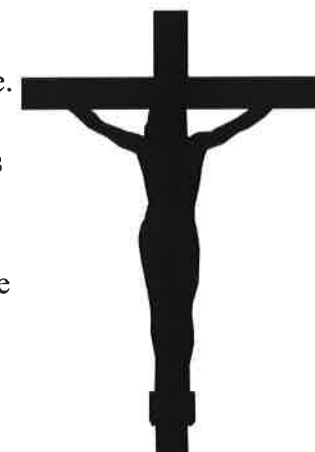
Together let's pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life, especially from within our own parish and diocese.

Has the scandal affected vocations? The scandal has seemed to have affected everything at this point: Mass attendance, financial generosity towards the Church in many dioceses, numbers entering seminary this year, etc. But we should not let the sins of a small minority of clergy pull down the devotion and fidelity of the many. Now more than ever we should pray for our Church, pray for holy vocations, and strive to be true disciples after the heart of Christ.

Also, recently it has come to my attention that many do not know how much the Church did in 2002 to create a new culture in the Church to prevent the abuse of children. The Pennsylvania report had very few incidents from 2002-present. The overwhelming majority were from before that time. Of course, unfortunately, as news of the priest in Athens county this past week reminded us, there is no completely failsafe way to protect everyone. However, a lot has been done in this area and next weekend in this column, I intend to list some of the ways that the Church changed since 2002.

Living the Liturgical Year Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes

November 10: St. Leo the Great, Pope and Doctor of the Church

Pope Leo I, reigned in the early Church from 440 to 461. It was during his pontificate that the Council of Chalcedon (451) defined that Christ is one divine person with two natures, divine and human. This is called the doctrine of the hypostatic union and was directed specifically against the Eutychianism heresy. One of Leo's most notable moments during his time as pope was his confrontation with Attila the Hun in 452. Attila and his army had invaded Italy. These fierce warriors were intent on sacking and burning Rome. When they arrived, Pope Leo went out to Attila, unarmed and with God-given eloquence persuaded this ruthless killer to turn back and mercifully leave Rome alone. Zuppa Toscana

| | |
|---------------------------------------|------------------------------------|
| 1 lb Italian sausage, casings removed | 1 tsp red pepper flakes (optional) |
| 1 large white onion, diced | 4 slices bacon |
| 2 tsp finely minced garlic | 8 cups chicken stock |
| 1 cup heavy cream | 1/4 bunch kale (about 2 cups) |
| 3 large potatoes, peeled and diced | |

Sauté sausage and red pepper flakes (if using) in large pot. Drain sausage and set aside. Discard fat. In same pot, sauté bacon, onions and garlic over medium heat or until onions are soft. Add chicken stock and bring to a boil. Add potatoes and cook until soft, about 1/2 hour. Reduce heat to low and add heavy cream and cook until heated through. Stir in cooked sausage and the kale and heat for 5 minutes. Serve with some crusty Italian bread. Buon appetito!

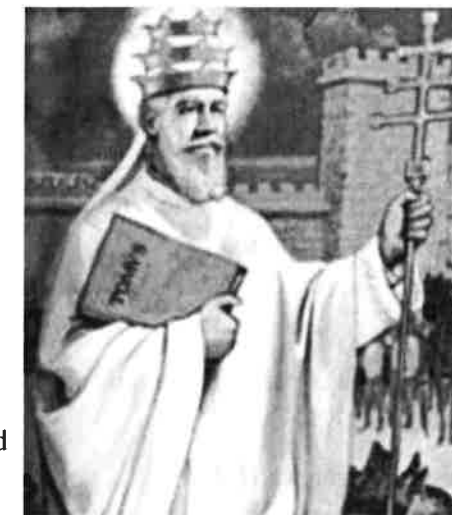
Prayer for the Intercession of St. Leo the Great

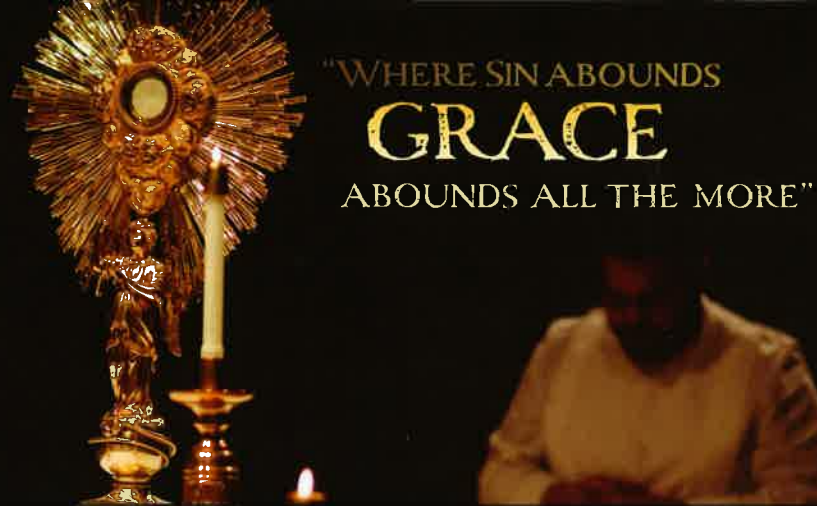

Discernment Group on Facebook

The phenomenon of "discernment groups" has become widespread in recent years because of their effectiveness in supporting young people. For those who can't join in person, there are two new Facebook groups: "The Collar" for men and "The Veil" for women. Just message to join, where you'll find Facebook live videos, group chat, and more. All to help men and women figure out God's call!

Needed: Men of Heroic Virtue

An Irish priest in America once told the story of how he was recruited from his native land. A bishop from Western Europe came to his seminary, which trained men for the missions, and painted a picture of comfortable rectories in a beautiful, peaceful country dotted with grand basilicas. Another bishop, from the American South, promised something different: remote, rural parishes, barely adequate rectories, few Catholics, and an oppressively hot climate. The Irish priest said that he and nearly every other classmate chose the latter.

Real men rise to challenges. And the Church needs brave men to answer the call to the priesthood. Being a priest should never be a vocation of last resort for men who could not marry or "make it" in the world. It is a vocation for strong men who love Jesus, who are striving for virtue and purity, and who are willing to lay down their lives for His Bride, the Church.

Thankfully, despite the very grave failings of too many clergy, the Church in America has some 40,000 priests, the vast majority of whom serve their people faithfully. During Vocation Awareness Week, let's pray for our faithful priests—and encourage promising young men in our parishes to seriously consider the priesthood.

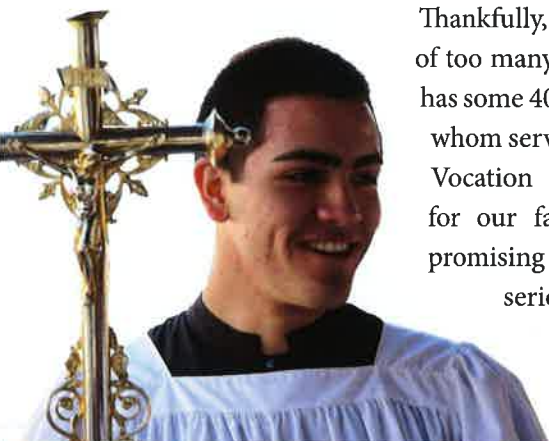
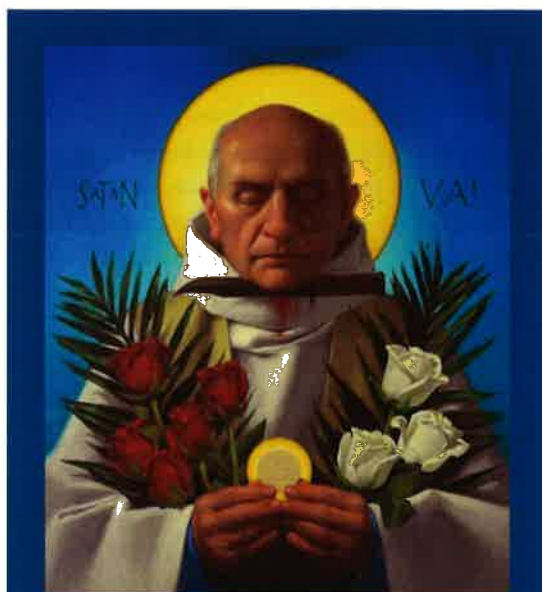

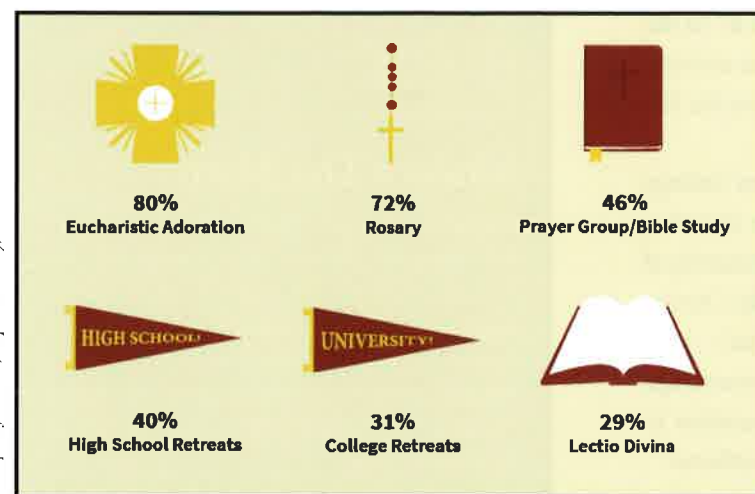
Modern-Day Martyr

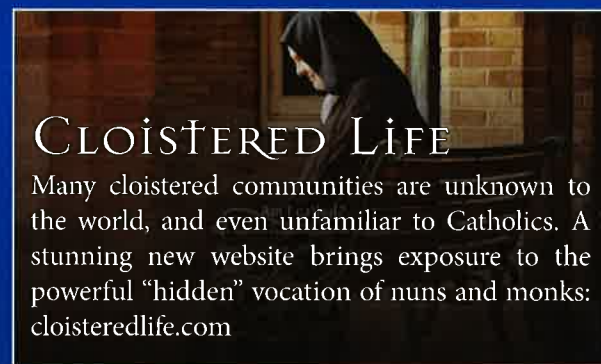
Prayer Practices of Future Priests

Figuring out one's vocation is rarely easy. The most essential element of discernment is forming a loving relationship with God through prayer. Thus it's no surprise that a 2017 CARA survey of recently ordained priests revealed a rich and diverse prayer life before they entered seminary, as the chart below shows.

This prayer life intensifies when men enter the seminary. They attend daily Mass and pray together the Liturgy of the Hours, and many seminarians now have community Holy Hours as well. All seminarians have a spiritual director who "coaches" them in their prayer life and spiritual formation.

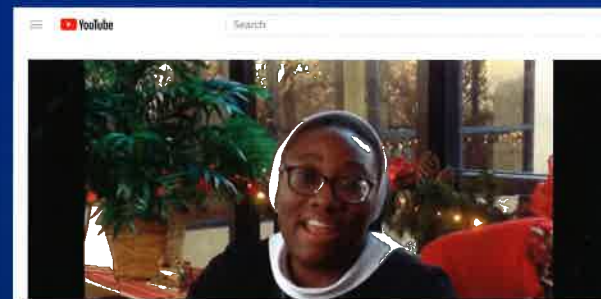
