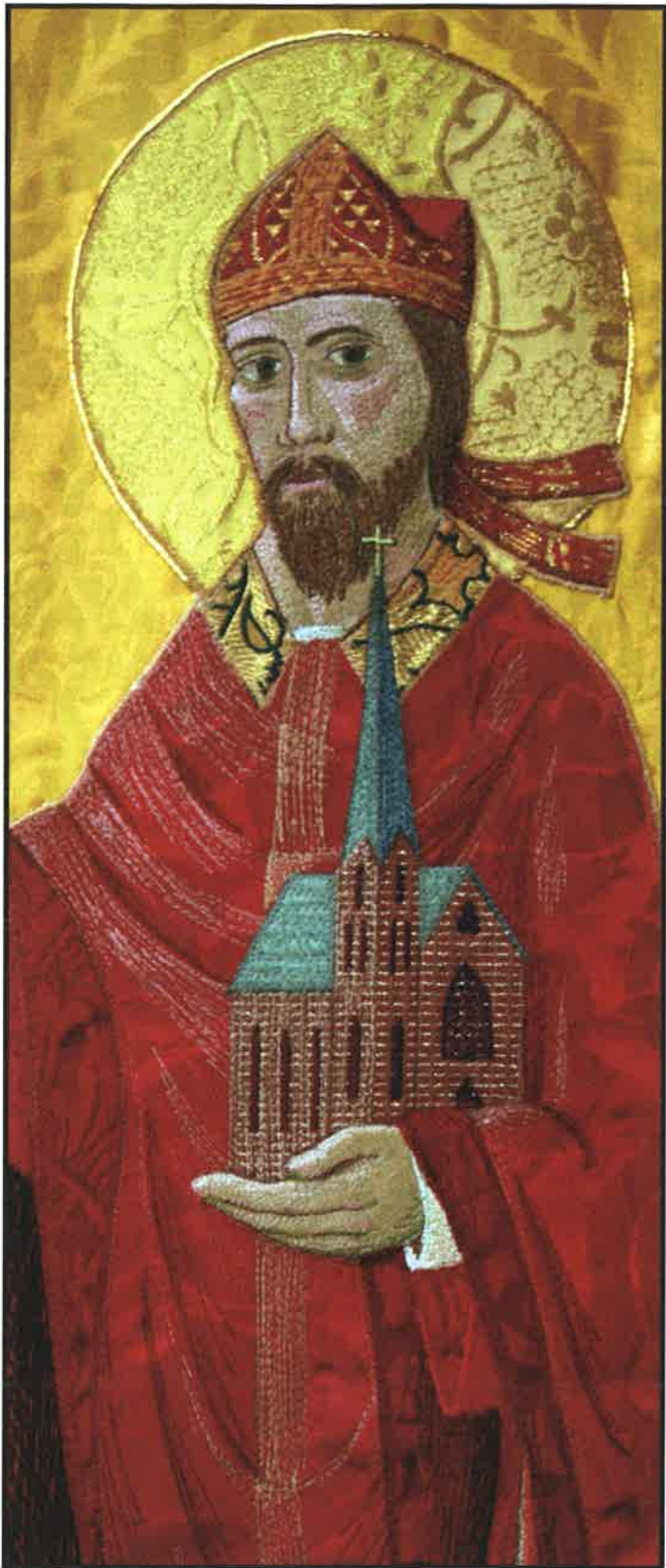

From the Desk of Fr. Dooley...

Thank you to all those who decorated our beautiful church, and to our servers, readers, ministers, and our organist Craig Jaynes, our Choir, and everyone who participated in our Christmas liturgies. May the Infant Jesus remind us that God comes to us in unexpected ways. We continue with our Christmas journey as we celebrate the *Solemnity of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph*. We celebrate the gift of family life and for the opportunities to grow in grace and love with our family members. This is not to say that family life does not have its share of challenges. We might be tempted to have a 'false picture' of family life. We see this all the time in our TV sitcoms and movies.

I remember as a boy staying with my Grandma Morgan who loved to watch the hit 1970s TV Show: *"The Waltons."* The show followed the challenges of a mountain family in the era of the Great Depression and the Second World War. I really never cared for this show (sorry to the fans out there!), but even as a boy, I was amazed that all of the family's problems were solved by the time the credits would roll down the screen. Wouldn't that be great? We could have all our family problems and issues solved in 30 minutes or less? Family life is not easy with schedules, sometimes putting our preferences over others, past hurts, finances, unemployment, and the list goes on.

Our Lord knew this reality of the challenges of family life. We know very little of Jesus' 'private life.' It is fascinating to think that Jesus 'waited' for about 30 years to begin his public ministry. This family life of Jesus was not a waste, but it was a time of preparation and patience. Jesus was growing, learning, and he spent his time waiting as a carpenter and citizen of Roman-occupied Nazareth. Life consists of a series of phases and we ask: what is our purpose? Jesus is our model for patience in the joys and struggles of family life. We pray for all families who are facing transitions and pains.

Now, let us take a look at our parish family here. It is always healthy to look over the past year as a parish- our strengths and what we could improve on for the future. Here is our "Year of Review" for 2018.

- ◆ Our parish had **11 baptisms** this year. We pray for those who received this sacrament and may they always know that they are claimed and loved by God.
- ◆ Next, there were **19 confirmations**. Please pray that these individuals will use the gifts of the Holy Spirit in their lives.
- ◆ The parish also celebrated **12 First Holy Communions** this past spring. May the Eucharist continue to be a source of nourishment and strength for all of us.
- ◆ St. Colman's had **two weddings** in 2018. We pray that they and all married couples will live out the covenant of marriage.
- ◆ While we celebrated joyous occasions, the parish had **13 funerals** this year. We are a people of faith who look to the Crucifixion and Empty Tomb of our Lord. We know that Jesus transforms darkness to light, and death never has the final say. We pray for all those who mourn the loss of loved ones this year.
- ◆ This past Easter, we welcomed 7 new Catholics into the Church. For Easter 2019, we have **4 individuals** who will be entering the Church. Please pray for all those entering the Church!

In other news, we were sad to see **Fr. Michael Hartge** leave for his new assignment as Pastor of the Perry County Consortium. We welcomed **Fr. Thomas Herge** this past July to the Consortium.

We have had so many spiritual and social events in our parish that it is hard to keep track! Thank you to all who have participated in the life of St. Colman's.

As the famous CBS anchorman Walter Cronkite would say at the end of each newscast: "And that's the way it is..." This is our summary as individuals, families, and as a community of faith. This was our year of 2018. May we have the courage to look at the problems and realities of our lives. May we go forward in 2019 and never forget that grace that God has given us.

Living the Liturgical Year
Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes

December 31: St. Sylvester I, Pope and Confessor

St. Sylvester, a native of Rome was pope during the reign of Constantine in the early part of the 4th century. The Basilica of St. John Lateran and the Church of St. Peter in the Vatican were built during his reign as pontiff. He also convoked the first Ecumenical Council of Nicaea to combat the Arian heresy and Donatist schism which were causing much discord in the Christian communities at the time. St. Sylvester was known as the first “peace” Pope after centuries of bloody persecution. He died on December 31, 335. December 31st is also the seventh day of the Octave of Christmas and the vigil of the solemnity of Mary the Mother of God. The Church does not celebrate New Year’s Day (our new year” started on the first Sunday of Advent!) it celebrates the glorious, all-holy, ever-Virgin Mary, the Mother of God!! What a great time to go to Mass and thank God for all His favors (and especially for His Mother) of the past year and to implore His blessings (through Mary’s intercession) for the new one!



Celebrate this day with some lovely punch!
 Perfect Punch (from catholicculture.org)
 1 cup sugar 1/8 tsp ginger
 1 cup boiling water juice of 6 lemons
 2 cups cranberry juice 1 quart apple cider
 1 large bottle club soda

Combine sugar and ginger in a small pot. Add boiling water, bring to boil and stir until the sugar dissolves. Cool. Add lemon juice. In punch bowl combine sugar-lemon mixture, cranberry juice, and cider. Just before serving, add ice and club soda. Makes 25 punch cup servings.
