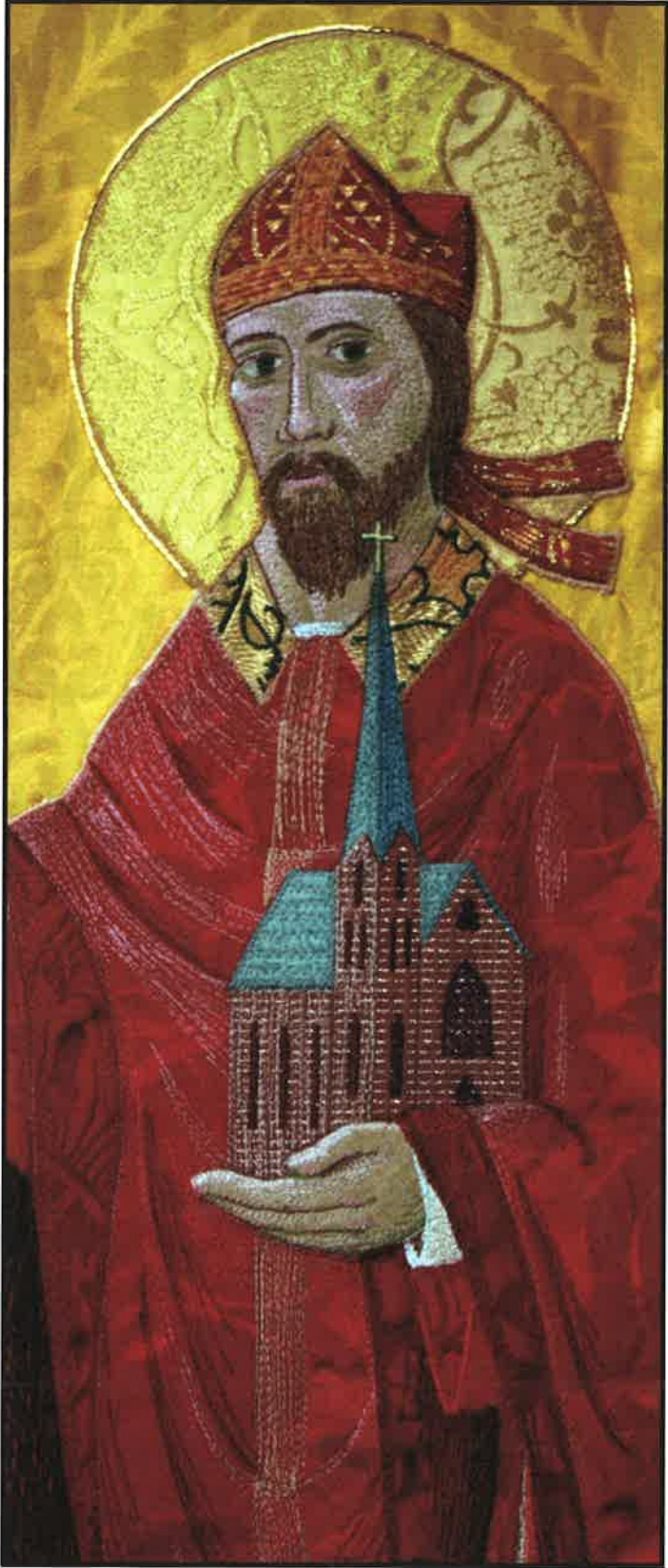

Do you read a story to your children before they go to bed? Here are some suggestions...

- ◆ *Bible Stories* by Michael Paydos has 100 short stories from Genesis to St. Paul in Rome. This is a good way to introduce famous tales of famous people they should know.
- ◆ *Tell Me the Secrets* by Max Lurado: While playing baseball, Eric hits a high ball and breaks a window in the Shadow House, a large neglected house nobody ever goes into. Landon and his sister, Shannon, persuade Eric to go with them to see if anyone lives there. A huge shadowy man holds the ball and asks, "Is this what you are looking for"? Quite a riveting opening!
- ◆ *Our Lady of Kibehe*, by Immaculee Ilibagiza: Every Catholic has heard about the Blessed Mary's visit to the three children of Fatima. Has anyone heard of the visions of the Blessed Mother to the village of Kibelo, Rwanda? The visions came between 1981-1989. This fascinating account is a must-read for lovers of Our Lady.

Michael Pennock's book, *Questions from Seventh Period*, helps teens find answers to questions they have about ethics, sex, confession and headlines about the Church in present time.

Bi-Monthly Mass of Healing, January 21, 6:30 PM, St. Joseph Cathedral

Following the Mass, a Healing Service will begin with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Veneration of relics of the True Cross. Each person then will then have an opportunity to speak individually with one of several priests present to discuss their particular situation and receive a prayer of healing; the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will also be available. The Healing Service will conclude with Benediction. All persons who seek Christ's healing are invited – especially those who suffer with physical illness and infirmities (e.g. cancer and other debilitating diseases and conditions), in addition to those seeking emotional and spiritual healing. All caregivers, family members, and members of the medical community are invited as well. Bi-monthly Healing Masses take place at the Cathedral on the third Monday of the month. In 2019 Bi-Monthly Healing Masses will be celebrated on January 21, March 18, May 20, July 15, September 16, and November 18. Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes

January 25: Solemnity of the Conversion of St. Paul

The Church celebrates this feast as a Solemnity because it was the beginning of Paul's ministry, the great Apostle to the Gentiles. Through Saul's personal encounter with the Risen Christ and his subsequent physical blindness his heart was opened to the Light which was the unity of the "body of Christ" and Jesus Christ himself. The effect of this encounter was profound and Paul saw that the Church and Christ are one and the same and it was to be his life's work to bring that message to the world. The celebration of this Solemnity is also a call to us to profound conversion when we encounter Christ, that is, it should be our life's work to make Him known to all we meet and to allow Him to be in charge of every aspect of our lives. Since Paul (Saul) was thrown from his horse, we thought it would be fun (and easy) to make these horseshoe cookies to have with tea.

RECIPE: Horseshoe Cookies (from catholicculture.com)

1 cup butter 1/2 cup confectioners sugar
2 tsp vanilla 2 cups all purpose flour
1/2 tsp salt 1 cup quick-cooking rolled oats

Instructions: Cream butter; add sugar gradually while continuing to cream; beat until fluffy. Stir in vanilla, flour and salt. Blend in rolled oats. Roll out about 1/4 inch thick on a lightly floured board. Cut into strips 6 inches long and 1/2 inch wide. On ungreased cookie sheets shape strips to resemble horseshoes. Bake at 325F for 15-29 min or until lightly browned. Remove carefully as cookies are delicate but go so well with tea!! Enjoy!

Thank you for your prayers for our pilgrims from St. Colman, St. Peter, and Waverly St. Mary who attended the March for Life in Washington, D.C. We continue to pray for the defense of all human life, especially the unborn. As we near the anniversary of the 1973 Roe vs. Wade decision, the Church will be observing a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection for Unborn Children on Tuesday, January 22nd. On this day, we are called to prayer, fasting, and giving alms to those who have been affected by abortion. May we continue to pray that all of us may safeguard life in all its stages.

We are entering into winter weather season! As we saw last weekend, the winter weather delivered snow and ice to us! Obviously, if it ever gets to a Level 3, all Masses and parish events are cancelled. Anything below a Level 3, please exercise common sense. The Sunday obligation is not meant to hurt anyone! If the roads are too dangerous in your area, then please stay home!

Please continue to pray for our Diocese and the worldwide Church. On Thursday, January 24th, we celebrate the Feast of St. Francis de Sales. He is the patron of the Diocese of Columbus. Created & Loved!

But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth. - 1 John 3:18

What a wonderful blessing that God created us in His own image! His loving act of creation gives every human value and worth that cannot be lost. From the unborn child, to the oldest of the elderly, the fingerprint of God can be found on their soul. They are a creation of the almighty God, a creation that He loves and cherishes.

Unfortunately it is clear that our society does not love and cherish each and every person as God does. Each day, in the United States alone, 2,904 babies are killed before being born!¹ The vast majority of the women having abortions do so for financial and lifestyle reasons.²

The elderly are also suffering. In countries that have legalized euthanasia involuntary killings have not only been documented but have become commonplace. In Belgium 32% of euthanasia cases did not have consent, and 17% of the elderly who

were killed were not talked to about their upcoming death because the doctors felt that killing them was "clearly in the patient's best interest."³

As our culture moves further into self-obsession it is the least among us who suffer most. But Christ, through His own sacrifice, has shown us the way to reverse this terrible trend. His example of love in action, shown especially to the lowly and humble, reveals the truth that ALL who love Him should have love that reaches out to the needy.

His solution is simple, to love one another (Jn 13:34); and this starts with you! Show your love by being the voice for the voiceless, by caring for those in need, and by loving those who the world rejects. Provide for the needy mothers, pray for the unborn babies, care for the elderly, and get involved!
