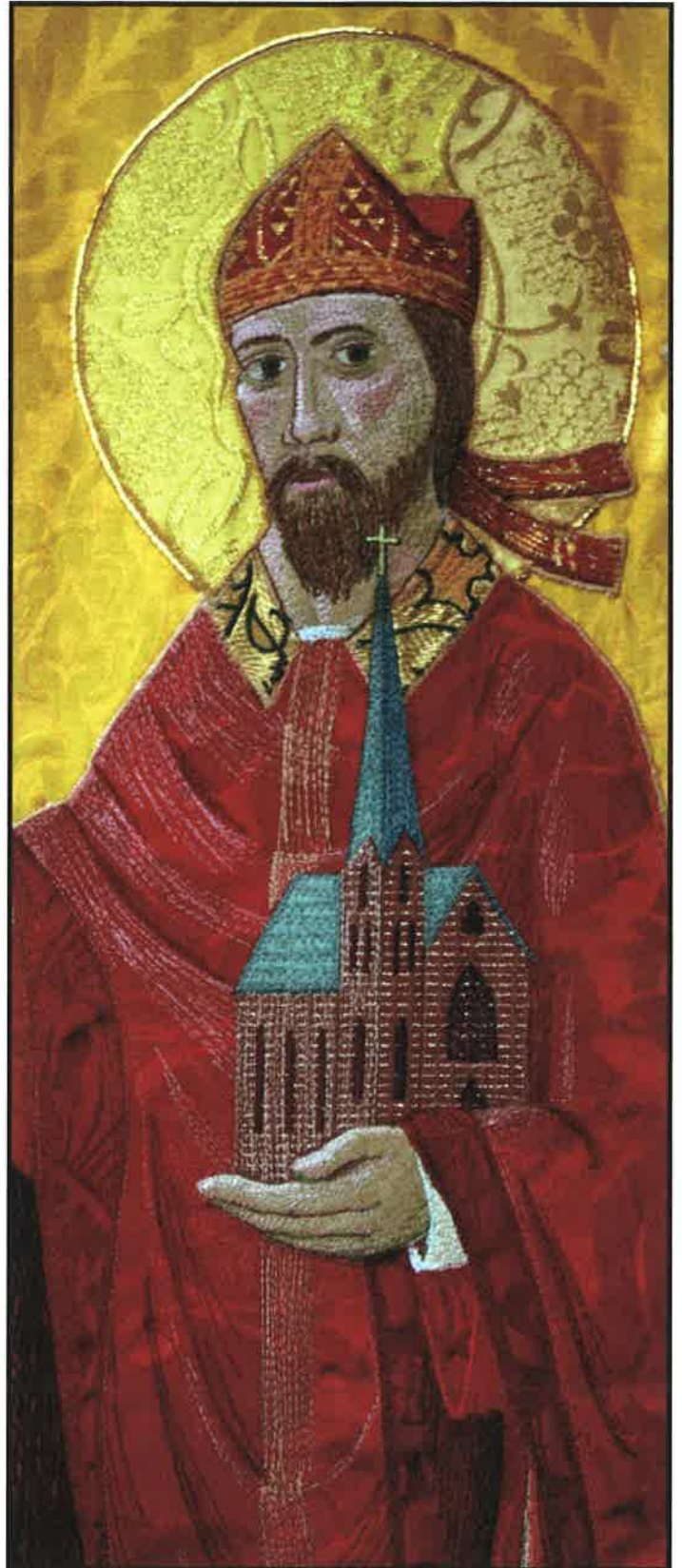

Library Notes

Divine Mercy

A Pocket Guide to Living the Divine Mercy by Rev. George W. Kosicki, C.S.B., is a little book (63 pages) that shows us the infinite ways God has mercy on us. This will help the readers to know and to convince us that God's mercy is available to all of us. We can all remember the short prayer of Sister Faustina, "*Jesus, I trust in You*".

Beautiful Mercy, by Matthew Kelly and 24 familiar authors provide simple, practical tips on how to be an instrument of that mercy. By focusing on the seven spiritual and corporal works of mercy, this helps readers realize acts of love are possible for all of us.

A Priest Answers 27 Questions You Never Thought to Ask, by Father Michael Kerper, is in the Catholic Church section. Examples include Who can receive last rites? Are guardian angels real? Why doesn't Pope Francis like pets?

God's Healing Mercy is by Kathleen Beckman. Through personal and scriptural sources, she shows us how to find peace and healing through the practice of mercy. From fear to trust, shame to mercy, from spiritual weakness to the Beatitudes, each chapter is very insightful.

Reclaiming an Ordered Soul by Christopher O. Beum. Are email, voice mail, TV and phone apps driving you crazy? Do you need to become more mindful? Celebrating Saints and Feats to Enrich Hearts and Homes

Week Of May 5th – May 11th

St Damien of Molokai (3 January 1840 – 15 April 1889) Father Damien was born Jozef ("Jef") De Veuster, the youngest of seven children. His parents were corn merchants. Growing up on a farm, it was assumed that he would eventually take over the farm. Instead, Jozef attended college in Braine-le-Comte, then entered the novitiate of the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary in Leuven. He took the name of Brother Damianus (Damien in French) in his first vows, presumably in reference to the first Saint Damian, an early Christian saint who was said to perform miracles. During his ecclesiastical studies, Damien prayed daily before a picture of St. Francis Xavier, patron of missionaries, to be sent on a mission. Three years later when Damien's brother Father Pamphile could not travel to Hawaii as a missionary because of illness, Damien was allowed to take his place. Once in Hawaii, he volunteered to minister to the colony of Lepers on the island of Molokai from where he was never to return. Damien worked with them to build a church and establish the Parish of Saint Philomena. In addition to serving as a priest, he dressed residents' ulcers, built a reservoir, built homes and furniture, made coffins, and dug graves. During this time, Father Damien had not only cared for the lepers, but also established leadership within the community to improve the state of living. Father Damien aided the colony by teaching, painting houses, organizing farms, organizing the construction of chapels, roads, hospitals, and churches. He also personally

OVEN KALUA PIG

3 lb pork butt
1 1/2 teaspoons liquid smoke
2 1/4 teaspoons Hawaiian salt, or sea salt, or kosher salt
Preheat oven to 350-400 degrees F. Pierce pork butt all over with carving fork or score with a knife. Rub salt and liquid smoke into meat. Place pork fat side up in a roasting pan or deep casserole dish. Cover and roast in oven for 2 1/2-3 hours. Remove the pork from pan and shred with two forks. Makes six servings.



FEASTING WITH THE SAINTS

MACADAMIA NUT CRUSTED COCONUT SHRIMP

1/4 cup all-purpose flour 1 pound cleaned and deveined shrimp
1/2 cup coconut milk
1/4 cup finely crushed macadamia nuts
Garnish: minced chives or green onions
Preheat oven to 400 degrees Fahrenheit. Lightly coat a baking dish with olive oil. Place flour in a small bowl. Dredge shrimp in flour, then dip into coconut milk and roll in crushed macadamia nuts. Place in baking dish and bake for 10 to 15 minutes, or until shrimp is cooked through. Serve 3 shrimp on a bed of rice, garnish with minced chives or green onions. Serve orange lime sauce dipping sauce on the side.

ORANGE LIME SAUCE

10oz jar orange marmalade
3 tablespoons tangy mustard
1 tablespoon lime juice.

dressed residents, dug graves, built coffins, ate food by hand with lepers, shared pipes with them, and lived with the lepers as equals. Father Damien also served as a priest during this time and spread the Catholic Faith to the lepers; it is said that Father Damien told the lepers that despite what the outside world thought of them, they were always precious in the eyes of God. He contracted leprosy himself and died on April 15th 1889 and was canonized on October 11th 2009. His feast day is May 10th.
