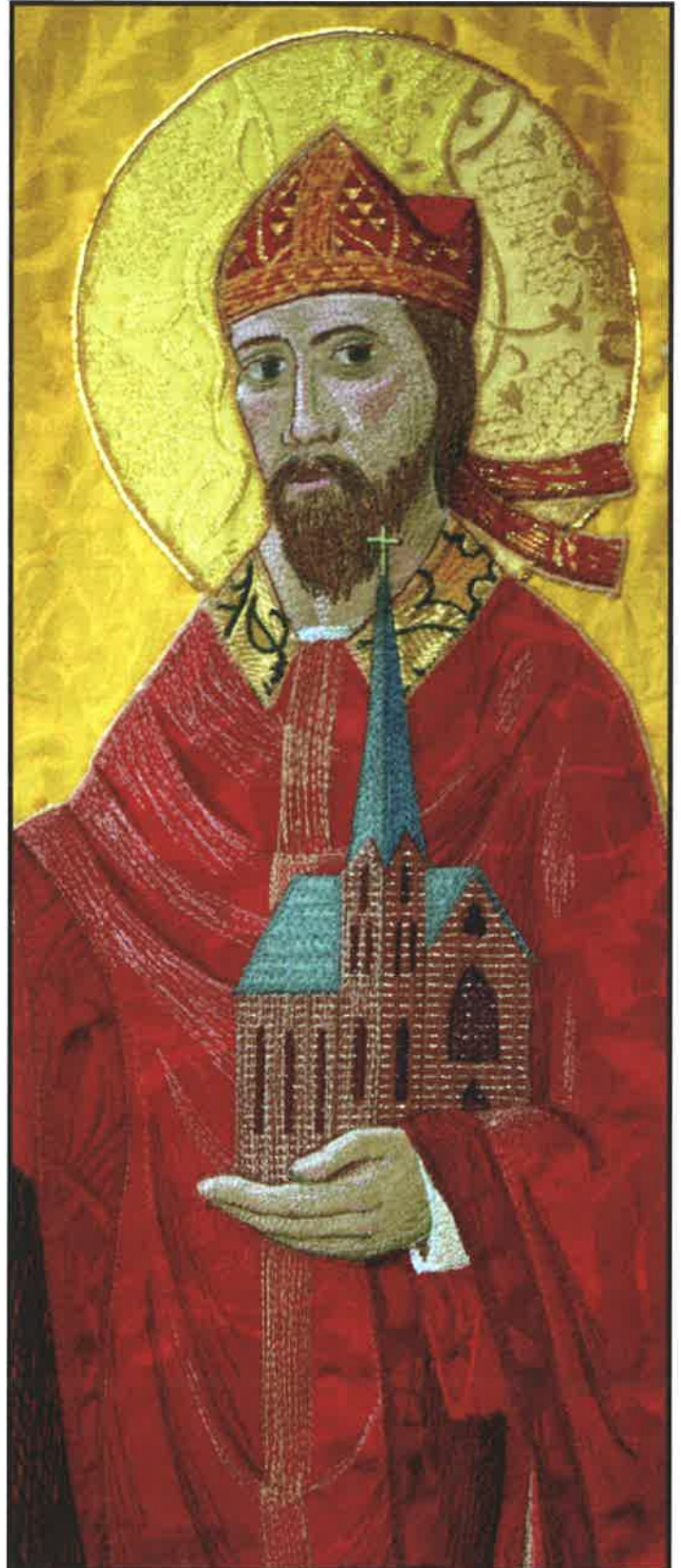

Tower Doors are Completed

THANK YOU to all of you who contributed to the Capital Improvements collections this past year going specifically to pay for the new tower doors. The doors are installed and finished. However, after much encouragement from the Diocese to limit the number of unlocked doors during Mass times, the tower doors will remain locked as an entrance. You can *always* exit through them from the inside at anytime - especially after Mass when many people are leaving at once. You will hear more about safety precautions and procedures in the coming months. (i.e. As we have done the past three years, we will secure a police presence for our Christmas Masses.) We are by no means trying to take away from the spiritual and holy experiences for which we gather in this sacred space each week to worship our Lord. However, we have a responsibility to keep everyone safe who enters our buildings - whether it be in case of a fire or tornado, medical emergency or violent threat. It is better to be prepared and not have to exercise our procedures than to need them and not have a sound plan of action in place. Tina applied for a grant from The Catholic Foundation to help offset some of the cost of this project. More information as to whether we receive the grant and the overall cost of the tower door project will be published in the near future. *Again, thank you for supporting this project and your continued generosity for our parish.*

October is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. These books will give you a better understanding of why this devotion is so important.



Jesus and Mary: Finding our Sacred Center is a homily Henri J.M. Nouwen gave to a gathering of priests. In it, he stresses that all people become little children and let Mary lead us to greater intimacy to her Son. The second part concerns his pilgrimage to Lourdes in 1990. It was a time of turmoil and he needed peace. In the quietness of the cave at Lourdes, and the Stations of the Cross, he describes how he found inner peace and joy. In only 65 pages, you may also find a way to peace and joy. MAR/NOU

In **Our Lady of Fatima's Peace Plan From Heaven**, you can read the short poignant story of the visions seen by the three children in Portugal. May 13, 1916 was the first of these visions and October 13, 1916 was the last time they saw her. In this 32 page booklet, you can read of the miracles that occurred during that summer. MAR/OUR

Mary My Mother by Father Lovasik is another short picture book for children. In only a few pages, Fr. Lovasik tells the story of Mary and her Son.
