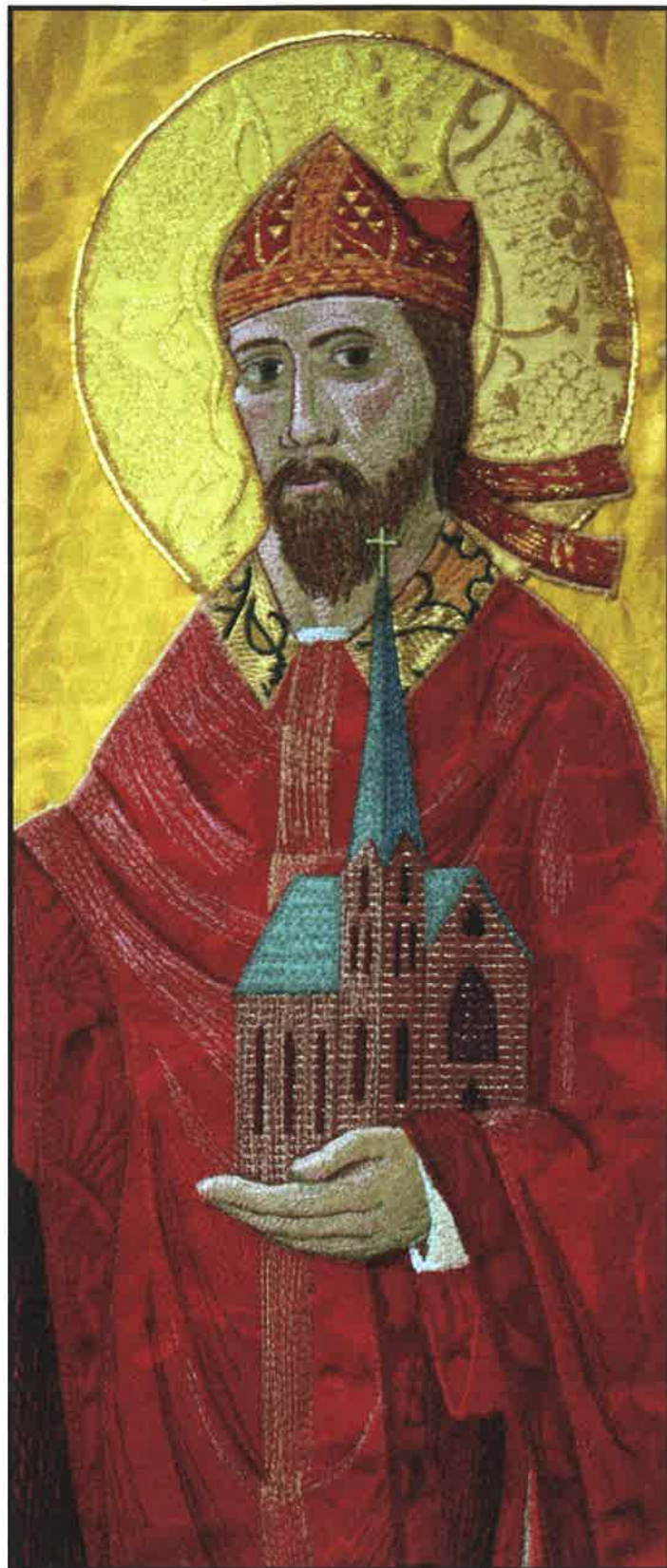

## A Message from Bishop Brennan

The Lord is Risen – Happy Easter!

The Ohio Bishops met yesterday. After consultation and a close examination of the facts determined that while it is not yet possible to begin the public celebration of Mass, we are looking at a target date of May 30/31 – Pentecost Sunday hopefully to resume our celebrations. Each of us continues to dispense all Catholics from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and I also dispense from the canonical obligation of Easter Duty. During his press conference yesterday, Governor DeWine indicated that through increased and widespread testing and other means, much knowledge will emerge to allow for safer conditions for the assemblies of people. In the meantime we will begin the gradual process in various ways.



This week many of our priests will begin setting aside dedicated time for the Sacrament of Reconciliation on a wide basis by appointment and in places deemed to provide for safety and hygiene. These locations will include spaces free of the need to touch surfaces such as doors or furniture, providing appropriate social distancing and privacy and limiting the number of people gathered at any one time to a bare minimum. The locations and contact numbers for appointments will be posted on our Diocesan Website ( [www.columbuscatholic.org](http://www.columbuscatholic.org) ) beginning Wednesday, April 29th so that appointments for confessions may be scheduled, and hearing confessions can begin Friday May 1st. We will be working to make it possible, in at least some of our churches, for people to visit and pray during certain hours in the coming weeks. Again, care for the continued health and safety of those who visit is paramount.

The process of preparing for Mass will encompass many considerations. We will work to be ensure that the Churches are clean and safe. We are working to have plans in place to manage seating and movement, allowing for safe social distancing; this may perhaps limit the number of people in the Church or any other spaces at any given time. We will follow the guidelines for assemblies regarding face-coverings and other protective measures. It may be necessary to adjust schedules to allow for priests to help each other beyond parish boundaries. In recent weeks, there has been a task force looking at the many opportunities for evangelization here in the diocese. Their work will turn to provide recommendations on how we as a diocese and as parishes use this time for pastoral and interior preparation.

Looking ahead with hope and anticipation, I ask for your prayers. Looking back, I can only do so with deep gratitude for your continued goodness, your sacrifices, your patience and understanding. I am convinced that the measures we have taken, together with the rest of our community, have made a significant difference. Let's pray for those who have suffered deeply, especially those who have died and those who mourn. And let's never forget the sacrifices and hard work that so many people heroically make for us and our well-being.

Dear St. Colman Parishioners:

We have good news. We are ready for the first phase of bringing back the availability of the sacraments. Bishop Brennan has announced that we can start offering confession, by appointment, in a very specific manner that will be outlined below. He did, however, want it to be clearly communicated that what the Vatican had clarified remains in force. That is...

**if someone is not able to get to confession, they can still receive the forgiveness of their sins by repenting, making an act of Love for God above all things, and making a resolve to go to confession once one is able to again. He wants this clear: Anyone who is in the at-risk category because of previous conditions or older in age, or for example, if you have a cough or a fever and are worried about possibly being a carrier, you are considered to meet the requirement of "not being able to confess at this time." In other words, just because the Stay-at-Home order is being lifted and confession is "available", that doesn't mean that it is necessarily "available for you" and thus, you shouldn't risk your or others' health by coming to confession. You would still be able to receive forgiveness of your sins by doing the above listed things from the Vatican.**

In order to maintain social distancing, and to avoid having people touching door handles, seats, etc., confession will be offered in one of the garage bays. Our process at this time is as follows:

Call Tina Garland at 937.728.1818. She will be keeping the schedule and will assign you to a 10-minute slot. **NOTE: This is not a time for pastoral counseling. You would just confess your sins and then receive penance and absolution. If you would like pastoral counseling, you can call me at the office, and we can schedule a phone call for that later.**

On the day and the time of your appointment

- ◆ Park your car in the parking lot in front of the Parish Hall
- ◆ **Remain in your car until your appointment time.**
- ◆ When you see the person scheduled before you exit the garage and get in his/her car, you can then get out of your car and proceed to the garage bay that is open. Follow the tape markings in and out of the garage bays.
- ◆ There will be a Knights of Columbus (K of C) member there to help facilitate this process. He will show you the spot (marked by an X in the bay) where you will stand for your confession.
- ◆ I will be in the back of the bay facing away from you. There will be an X marking the spot, 10 feet from me, where you will stand to make your confession.
- ◆ By default, then no confessions will be face-to-face.

You are asked to please wear a mask. I will also be wearing a mask. You must also take your temperature before leaving your house. If you have a temperature of 100.4 or higher, please DO NOT come to confession. Call Tina and cancel your appointment. Also, if you have a fever or a cough the day of your appointment, please cancel it as a precaution (even if your temperature is not 100.4 or higher).

You should NOT show up more than five minutes early for your appointment as we want to avoid a line of people and a crush on social distancing.

If you are worried about anonymity, be assured that I will not be seeing the list of who is coming to confession, only Tina and the K of C member will have that information. And it is important to note that neither Tina or the K of C assistant will be able to hear your confession. It will be completely private.

Tina will ask you for a contact number when you call to schedule your appointment. This is so that if I am experiencing a fever or a cough, she can call you to let you know that the confessions have been cancelled as a precaution.

Confession examinations of Conscience will be available from the K of C member, but if you take one, please take it home or discard it in the trash dumpster in the parking lot when you are finished.

As we begin to phase back in as a society, we are going to need to be conscious of a new, and thus at first, strange way of doing things. However, we know that these kinds of precautions can help us avoid a re-emergence of the virus. On the other hand, if we return to things as normal, it is very likely that we would end up with a new surge, and subsequently a new stay-at-home order. This is the first step in offering sacraments in a COVID-world. The bishops are still discussing how and when to implement a return to public Masses. Hopefully we'll have more information on that soon. In the meantime, let us pray for all of the victims of the virus as well as all of those on the frontlines in the fight.

### Online Giving



Setting up an account is very easy! Click on the "online giving" box on the St. Colman webpage at [www.stcolmanwch.org](http://www.stcolmanwch.org). A new browser will open to the OSV website with all of our church information filled in for you.

Click on the **green button labeled "Create New Account"** found underneath the Login button. Complete your Profile Information to create an account.

When you log into your account, you will be able to see all of the various funds to which you can donate to at any given time — including the St. Vincent de Paul Society until we are able to resume Masses in the church.

Even though you were instructed two months ago to make your contributions directly to St. Vincent de Paul, this is a critical time for them to be able to receive monetary donations. To that, we have made it possible for you to donate to the St. Vincent de Paul Society directly from our Online Giving portal.

Online Giving is SAFE, SECURE and CONVENIENT. You can either choose to make an electronic withdrawal from your checking or savings accounts. Or you can charge your contributions to a credit card. Either way allows your giving to continue even though we are not gathering in the church these next few weeks.

**Don't feel comfortable using Online Giving?** It is perfectly fine to continue your tithing by mailing your checks to the Parish Office at 219 S. North Street, Washington CH 43160. Remember to write separate checks for the different funds to which you are contributing as most often they go into different accounts. If you are mailing a check for St. Vincent de Paul, make it out to St. Vincent de Paul because that check will be given directly to them and not deposited into the church's banking account.

### From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Parishioners of the Consortium,

This past Friday we were able to start offering confessions under the new procedures. Please see the webpage for that information and what number to call to schedule an appointment for confession. As you would have read in the Bishop's letter posted this past week, the Bishops are planning on re-starting public Masses on Pentecost weekend (5/30-31). We are still working out what that will look like: maintaining social distancing (in the pews and in going up for Communion), everyone wearing masks, sanitizer at all doors, etc. Even when that happens, persons at-risk should still not attend, and I have no doubt a clear dispensation will be given by the Bishop to that effect. It will be a while before "normal" parish life returns, but we are trying to work out ways to best give access to the Sacraments while doing our part to help protect lives. Let's keep the Bishops, and all leaders, in our prayers during this time as they help us navigate the waters. We look forward to the day that we can all gather together to worship as we once did.

In the meantime, another spiritual practice you might consider for you and/or your family is to consecrate your home to the Sacred Heart. This is a devotion by which you enthrone Christ as King of your home. During normal times, some Sacred Heart team members, the sisters and sometimes a priest would travel to your home for the final day of your preparation and do the consecration with you. However, it is not necessary to have a priest, sister, or team member at your consecration. Your home is *your* domestic church. You can consecrate, or re-consecrate it, if you have already consecrated it to the Sacred Heart. The Sacred Heart Columbus team has put together some great videos and materials to make it easy for you to do the consecration during this time. It focuses on developing a targeted job search which leverages one's personal and professional networks, rather than relying on the dark hole of the internet. Those organizations are the outreach of the church for the general public.

Also, I know the St. Vincent DePauls and Outreach have had quite a demand during this time, so your continued generosity towards them (if you are in a position to do so), is greatly appreciated.
