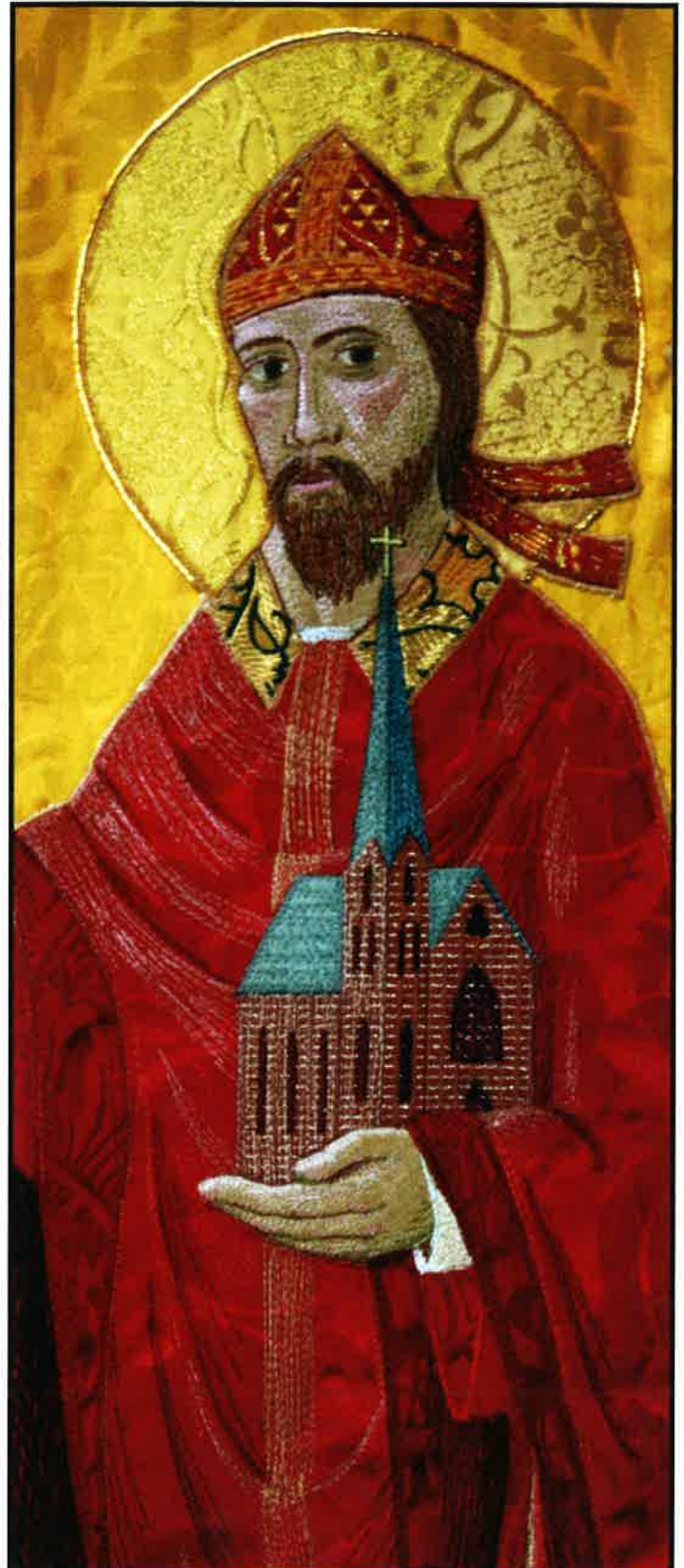

From the Pastor's Desk...

Purgatory is a great mercy of God in that it purifies, prepares, perfects those who have passed away in an imperfect state, so that they will be able to enter heaven. While purgatory is a place of hope it is also a place of suffering and sorrow.

November is the month in which we are called by Holy Mother Church to make an additional effort to prayer for the dead. While it is important to pray for those souls in purgatory throughout the year, in November this prayer is intensified and we are called to make it more frequently. Prayer for the dead has been a part of the practice of the Church from the first days of the Christian faith, and this practice is so beneficial not only for those for whom prayers are offered, but also for the one who prays for them. Because the souls in purgatory are unable to pray for themselves, we must help them. By obtaining merit on their behalf through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving we can hurry them on their way to the glories of eternal life. In working for the salvation of the souls in purgatory, we increase our own charity, the whole goal of our existence, loving and glorifying God. Also, those souls for whom we have labored in this life will never cease to pray for us once they are inhabitants of their heavenly home. This is great economy of salvation—the more we give the more is given to us.

To help the faithful start off this month the right way, the Church provides the opportunity for special indulgences during the first eight days of the month:

An indulgence is granted the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the dead. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls in purgatory. This indulgence is a *plenary* one from November 1 through November 8 and can be gained on each one of these days. On the other days of the year, this indulgence is a *partial* one. (*Enchiridion Indulgentiarum*, §13)

This is a wonderful gift we give for those who have gone before, since a plenary indulgence remits all of the temporal punishment due to sin and once gained, releases that soul to heaven. I will be making my own visits to our cemetery and praying for the dead, November 1st through the 8th at noon. All are welcome who would like to join me, but whether you come at noon or not, I would encourage you to make some prayerful visits to the cemetery during these eight days.

Additionally, this All Souls day, November 2nd, we will have three Masses. The first will be the regular Monday morning Mass at 8:30am. This Mass will be offered for all the faithful departed. The second Mass will be offered at 9:15am for the intentions of the Holy Father. This Mass will be offered as a low Mass in the extraordinary form of the Roman Rite which is in Latin. The third will be a special Mass offered at 7pm and will be offered as a combined intention for all of those departed whose names are written on the All Souls Day Remembrance Offering Envelopes turned in by Wednesday, October 28th.

Finally, below is the prayer of St. Gertrude the Great for the souls in purgatory, said to release one thousand souls from purgatory every time it is offered devoutly.

Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Most Precious Blood of Thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the masses said throughout the world today, for all the holy souls in purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen.
