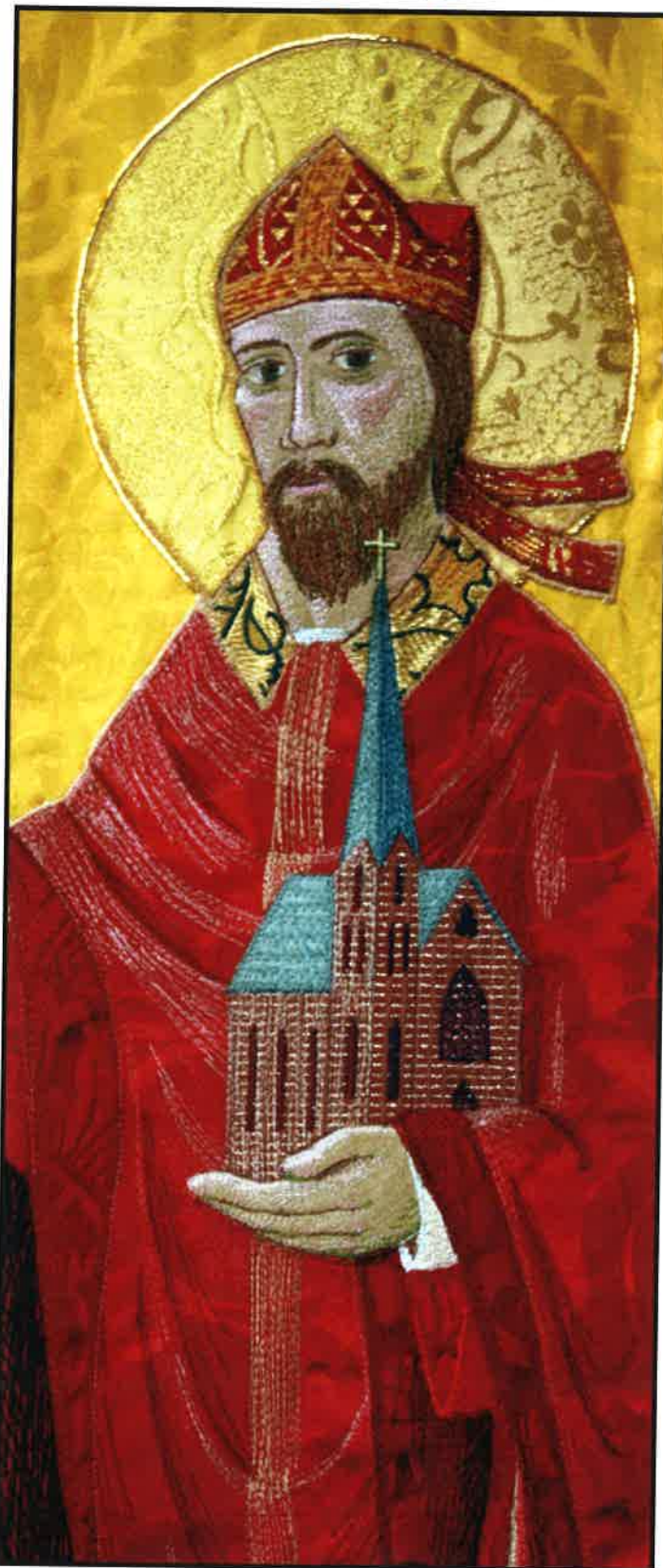

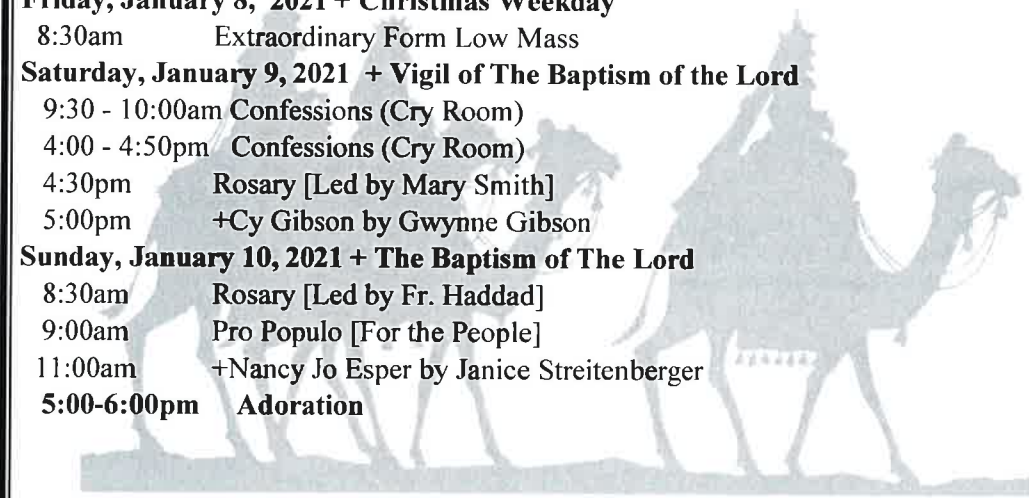

From the Pastor's Desk...

F“Epiphany” is derived from the Greek, meaning “to show forth.” The feast of the Epiphany is the celebration of the mystery of the manifestation of Our Lord’s Divinity. This celebration focuses on three events in the life of Our Lord, namely the miracle of wedding feast at Cana, the Baptism of the Lord, and the visit of the Magi. In the Eastern Church the emphasis has always been on the Baptism of the Lord, but in the West there is a specific feast for the Baptism of the Lord and emphasis has fallen on the Magi.

As a consequence of the emphasis on Baptism in the Eastern Churches and in connection with the transforming of water into wine, i.e. something more than water, the Eastern Churches have had the tradition of various blessings of water for the feast of the Epiphany. Later, this tradition of having special blessings of water has been imported into the Western Church, beginning in some Italian dioceses and in diocesan rituals found elsewhere. Finally, the blessing of water on the Eve of the Epiphany became universalized in the *Rituale Romanum* in 1890. This is a beautiful and powerful blessing and it is our good fortune to have it available in the Latin Church.

Reserved to the bishop, only those priests to whom the bishop gives the faculty can perform this blessing. Bishop Brennan has given graciously this faculty to me, so we are able have the blessing here at St. Colman. The blessing includes the Litany of the Saints, several Psalms and either the *Benedictus* or the *Magnificat*, as well as the *Te Deum*. The heart of the blessing is the special exorcism of the water. When holy water is made, the salt is exorcised and blessed then the water is exorcised then blessed, then the two are combined and there is a prayer prayed over the water with salt in it. Usually, those exorcisms are rather short and basic. For this one night, however, there is a special exorcism of the water. Here is a translation of this exorcism:

In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ and by His power, we cast you out, every unclean spirit, every devilish power, every assault of the infernal adversary, every legion, every diabolical group and sect; be gone and stay far from the Church of God, from all who are made in the image of God and redeemed by the precious blood of the divine Lamb. Never again dare, you cunning serpent, to deceive the human race, to persecute the Church of God, nor to strike the chosen of God and to sift them as wheat. For it is the Most High God who commands you, He to whom you heretofore in your great pride considered yourself equal; He who desires that all men might be saved and come to the knowledge of truth. God the Father commands you. God the Son commands you. God the Holy Spirit commands you. The majesty of Christ, the eternal Word of God made flesh commands you; He who for the salvation of our race, the race that was lost through your envy, humbled Himself and became obedient even unto death; He who built His Church upon a solid rock, and proclaimed that the gates of hell should never prevail against her, and that He would remain with her all days, even to the end of the world. The sacred mystery of the cross commands you, as well as the power of all the mysteries of Christian faith. The exalted Virgin Mary, Mother of God commands you, who in her lowliness crushed your proud head from the first moment of her Immaculate Conception. The faith of the holy apostles Peter and Paul and the other apostles commands you. The blood of the martyrs and the devout intercession of all holy men and women commands you.

Therefore, accursed dragon and every diabolical legion, we adjure you by the living God, by the true God, by the holy God, by the God who so loved the world that He gave His only-begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but shall have life everlasting; cease your deception of the human race and your giving them to drink of the poison of everlasting damnation; desist from harming the Church and fettering her freedom. Begone Satan, you father and teacher of lies and enemy of mankind. Give place to Christ in whom you found none of your works; give place to the one, holy, Catholic, and apostolic Church, which Christ Himself purchased with His blood. May you be brought low under God's mighty hand. May you tremble and flee as we call upon the holy and awesome name of Jesus, before whom hell quakes, and to whom the virtues, powers, and dominations are subject; whom the cherubim and seraphim praise with unwearied voices, saying: Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of hosts!

All holy water is efficacious against the diabolical. In fact, the final prayer over holy water includes its primary use:

May this creature of yours [the creature to which the prayer refers here is the water itself], when used in your mysteries and endowed with your grace, serve to cast out demons and to banish disease. May everything that this water sprinkles in the homes and gatherings of the faithful be delivered from all that is unclean and hurtful; let no breath of contagion hover there, no taint of corruption; let all the wiles of the lurking enemy come to nothing. By the sprinkling of this water may everything opposed to the safety and peace of the occupants of these homes be banished, so that in calling on 212 your holy name they may know the well-being they desire, and be protected from every peril; through Christ our Lord.

So, we see that holy water is primarily for the banishment of the diabolical, the Devil and his agents. Realizing that this is the purpose of holy water may provoke the question, “I’m not possessed and I don’t have any supernatural presence in my house, so why do I need holy water?”

The reality is that possession, vexation, oppression, obsession, and infestation are extraordinary kinds of diabolical activity. The use of the word “extraordinary” to describe this is intentional. These manifestations of the diabolical are exceedingly rare. There is, however, ordinary diabolical activity. This is in the form of temptation. While we are often our own enemies and our weaknesses draw us to commit sin or keep us from those duties and obligations to God and to one another we have, the demonic also exploits our weaknesses and tempts us into action and inactions which separate us from God. Indeed these forces are a constant presence in our lives. This is not extraordinary or astounding. It’s not something to get overly worked up about. It is, however, something to combat regularly, consistently, and fiercely. We do this in prayer. We do this in acts of Faith, Hope, and Charity. We do this in building the cardinal virtues. Most of all we do this by regular participation in the Sacraments Our Lord gave us. One way, is by sacramentals given to us by the Church. Holy water is one of these great sacramentals specifically for the resistance to the demonic. And as we can see from the prayer of exorcism above, Epiphany water is extra powerful holy water.

If I use this water, will I never be troubled by the demonic again. Probably, not. The uses of this powerful sacramental is another weapon we can use in the spiritual combat in which we find ourselves embroiled. Epiphany water is a formidable weapon we can add to our arsenal, along with the Rosary, meditation on the word of God, thousands of other prayers, devotionals, and sacramentals, but most of all we know the most effective tool against the Devil is uniting ourselves whole heartedly to the Sacrifice of Our Lord when we prayerfully attend Mass, the source and summit of the whole Christian life.
