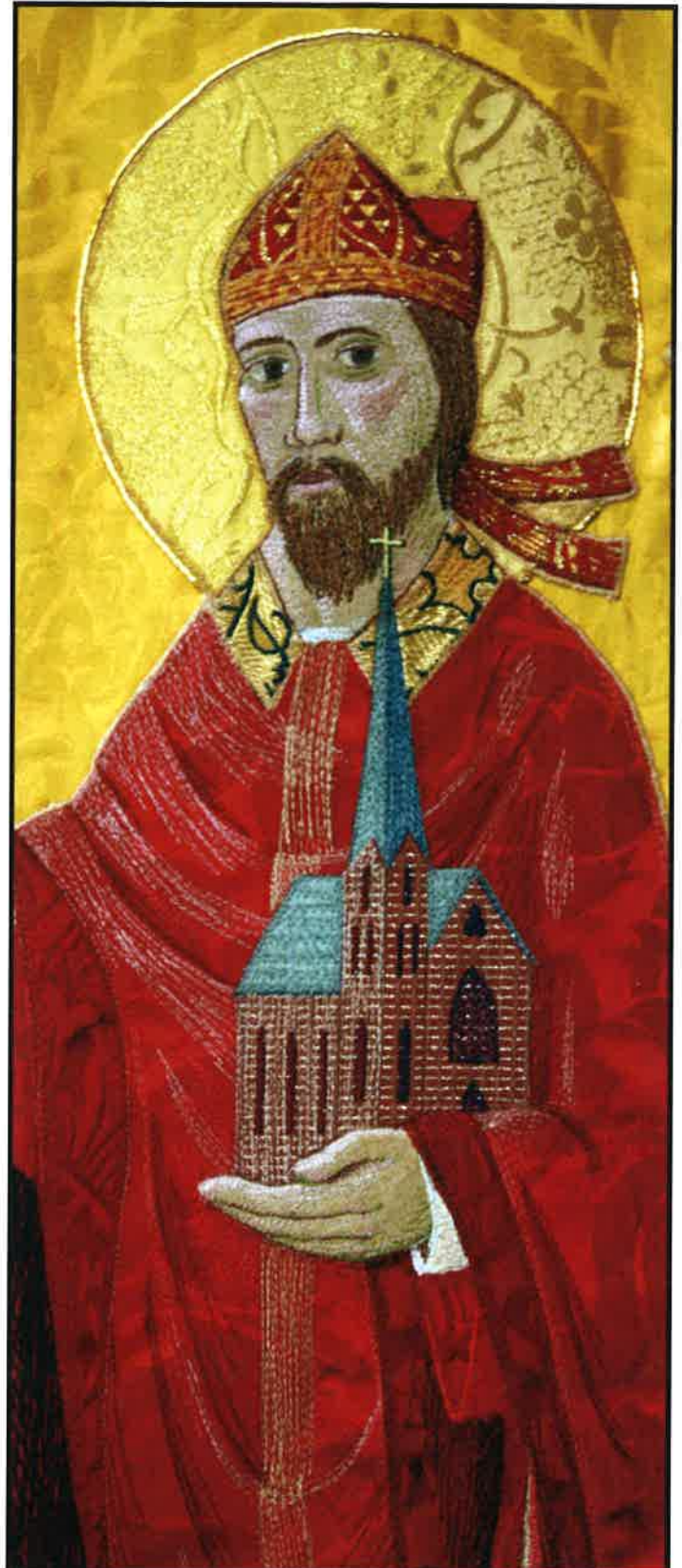

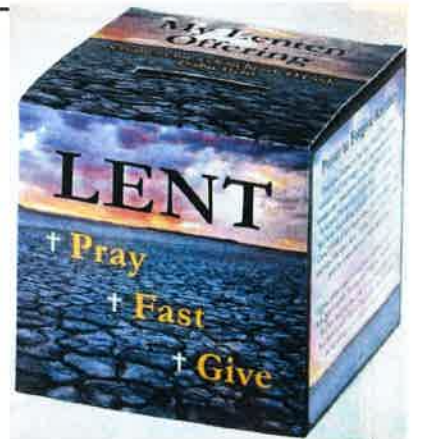
The Catholic Bishops have granted the dispensation of the weekly obligation to attend weekend Mass indefinitely. Those who are feeling well and who are not in the high risk categories are encouraged to come to Mass. Those in the high risk categories, or who are not feeling well, are encouraged to remain home.

If you choose to attend Mass, face masks are required as well as a ticket for the weekend Mass that you want to attend (including the new Sunday Mass at 11am.). Tickets may be obtained via the link on the St. Colman website or by calling the Parish Office before Thursday. Daily Masses do not require a ticket to attend.

Offering Box

Again this year instead of the CRS Rice Bowl Project, we are doing our own Offering Box program. 50% will go to our St. Vincent DePaul Society to help those in need in our area. 50% will go to a special project at the orphanage we help support in Uganda: Miryante Orphanage. Be sure to take an offering box home with you today, fill it up throughout Lent with your gifts of alms, and then bring it back on Holy Thursday or Easter. As the boxes are smaller than the Rice Bowls, you might consider placing a bag near it at home to collect further, or take home a second box. Extra boxes can be found in the back of church.

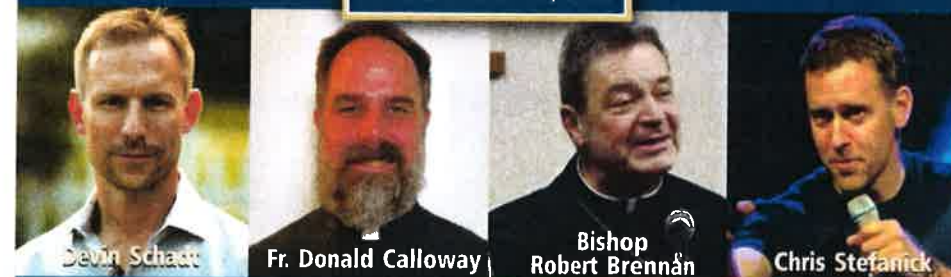

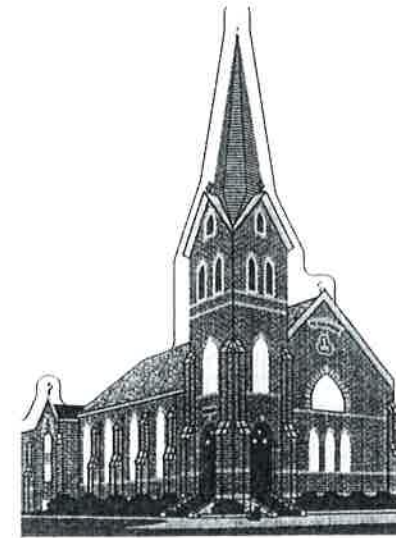

Ash Wednesday Mass and Liturgy Schedule Wednesday, February 17



To accommodate the number of people who may have a desire to receive ashes, Father has added two liturgies in addition to the Masses already scheduled for Ash Wednesday.

Masses will be held at 9am and 7pm.

Liturgies of the Word will be held at Noon and 6pm.

(These are not communion services.)

Both will include the distribution of ashes.

Ticketing will begin at 12:00am Monday. It will close at 11:30pm Tuesday for the 9am Mass and Noon liturgy service. It will close at Noon for the 6pm liturgy service and 7pm Mass.

From the Pastor's Desk...

Lent begins this Wednesday.



Ash Wednesday at St. Colman will include **Masses at 9:00am and 7:00pm**. There will be a liturgy of the word with the **distribution of Ashes at Noon and at 6:00pm**

Now that we are on the doorstep of Lent, we want to decide how we will embrace Lent this year, and the penance to which we are called for this season. What might we offer up in fasting? What more might we take on, in prayer? What might we give of ourselves, in almsgiving?

Furthermore, we know that while we are dispensed from attending Mass, we are not exempt from the obligatory penitential practices of the Church.

"Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 and up.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection."¹

"Abstinence laws consider that meat comes only from animals such as chickens, cows, sheep or pigs --- all of which live on land. Birds are also considered meat. Abstinence does not include meat juices and liquid foods made from meat. Thus, such foods as chicken broth, consomme, soups cooked or flavored with meat, meat gravies or sauces, as well as seasonings or condiments made from animal fat are technically not forbidden. However, moral theologians have traditionally taught that we should abstain from all animal-derived products (except foods such as gelatin, butter, cheese and eggs, which do not have any meat taste). Fish are a different category of animal. Salt and freshwater species of fish, amphibians, reptiles, (cold-blooded animals) and shellfish are permitted."²

Fun Fact: Hot pretzels are a delicious, traditional Lenten food.
