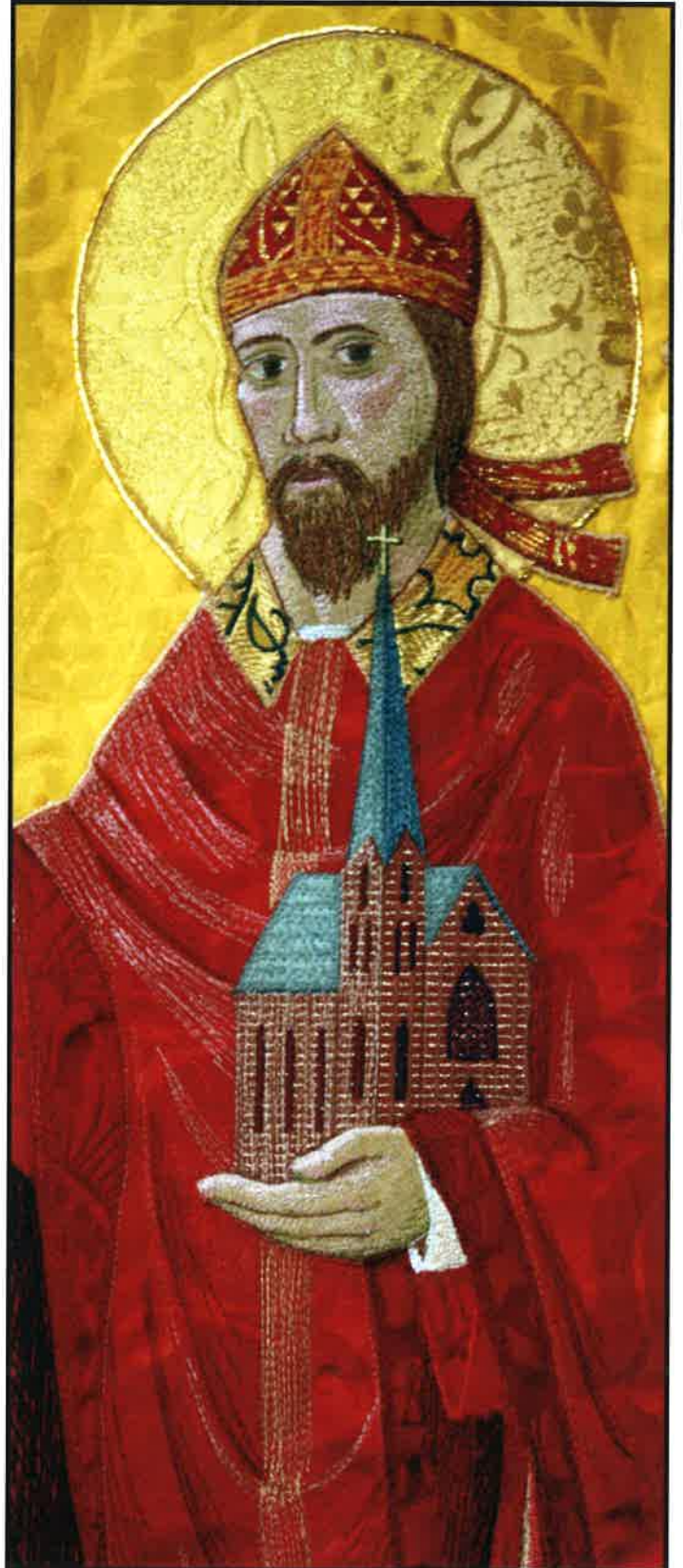

Real Presence, Real Future reflections: As the Father Loves Us by Deacon Steve Petrill, St. Joan of Arc Parish

"Jesus said to his disciples: 'As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love.'" Christ reaches out to us as friends, inviting us to remain, to dwell, in His love. We draw close to God by loving our neighbor as Christ loves us: through self-sacrifice, trust in God, and fully giving of ourselves. We cannot do this alone. Individually and as Church, we are brought into the life of God, healed, nourished, and sustained by Christ's real presence. In the same way Christ is with us, we are called to be truly present to one another.

F rom the Pastor's Desk...

In the Gospel this week, Our Lord's words may seem to contain a contradiction; rather, they contain a mystery of which we ought to be keenly aware and take to our prayer and meditation.

The words of Our Lord run thus:

You are my friends if you do what I command you.
I no longer call you slaves,
because a slave does not know what his master is doing.
I have called you friends,
because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father. (John 15: 14-15)

Here we have Our Lord Who is saying to the Apostles that they are no longer slaves, but rather friends. In our modern understanding this would mean that Our Lord is relinquishing His authority and power over the Apostles. Indeed, for friendship to exist in a natural way, there must be some measure of equality between the friends.

Our Lord, however, relinquishes none of His Authority. Indeed, following His commandments is a condition of His friendship. This is clearly different than the friendships we normally have. No one could reasonably expect to have this as a condition of friendship, and what's more, if we were to see such a "friendship" we would call it exploitative.

Additionally, the Apostles do not lose their relationship to Christ as slave. In fact, apostles are quite fond of introducing themselves as slaves of Christ: St. Paul (Titus 1:1), St. James (1:1), St. Peter (2 Peter 1:1), St. Jude (Jude 1:1). It is the first thing they announce about themselves along with being an apostle. So the Apostles remain slaves to Jesus Christ. (*Nota Bene:* Your Bible may say "servant" instead of "slave". The Greek word "δοῦλος" means slave. Servants were not employees, but were slaves at this point in history.)

So, what does this mean for us and our relationship to Jesus? Are we slaves of Christ or are we friends? We call Christ Our Lord. We are indeed both. Our Lord has told us what He is doing. Our Lord has trusted us with His plan of redemption and salvation for the world. We are friends, but friends with Our Master. We are slaves, but slaves who willingly lay down our lives in service to Christ and the Gospel. Christ, by His Divinity, has power and Authority over us as creatures, but by His Victory on the Cross, He has also claim to His Kingship and Authority by merit of His actions. To this we willingly surrender our lives, because He willingly surrendered His first. To no one and nothing else could we be both friend and slave. No one and nothing else offer us infinite love and salvation.
