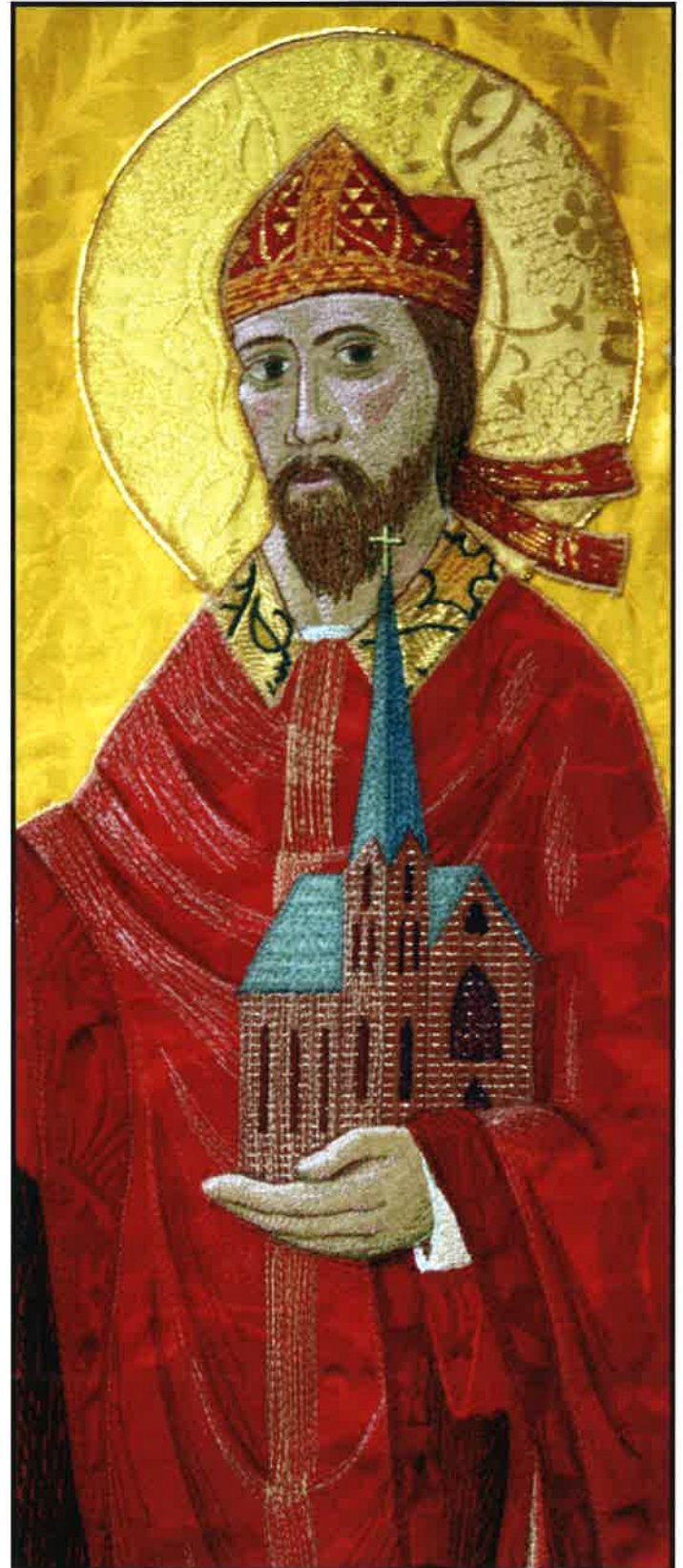

## From the Pastor's Desk...

Next week we will be celebrating Pentecost. While it is well known, often we lack a full appreciation of the importance of this feast. The Feast of Pentecost has a significance up there with Christmas and Easter. In fact, Pentecost used to have its own octave, like Christmas and Easter do. In fact, the octave of Pentecost used to rank higher than the octave of Christmas. Why is Pentecost so important? Pentecost marks the dispensation of the Holy Spirit, the Παράκλητος (Paraclete), which means Advocate or Counselor, and does have legal connotations, as Our Lord had promised.

This is the Spirit which animates the life of the Church. The Holy Spirit guides and protects the Church in times of trouble and ensures that the Church never teaches anything contrary to Divine Revelation. The Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Blessed Divine Trinity was sent to the Church to build, sustain, and vivify her. While there may be troubles in the Church, we can see the working of the Holy Spirit sustaining the Church throughout Salvation History and without the assistance of the Holy Spirit, the Church would have been destroyed so many times over.

It is not just the Church as a corporate body which receives the Holy Spirit, we each do in the Sacrament of Confirmation. Just as the Spirit empowered St. Peter and the Apostles to bear witness to the faith in bold and powerful way. So, does the same happen to us. We who have received the Holy Spirit have been given the strength and the charge to bear witness to the Gospel, to Christ and His Church. We are empowered to go to any lengths to witness to Christ and let nothing get in our way. No matter how difficult or seemingly insurmountable the obstacle, we can trust that the Holy Spirit is empowering us to be a witness of the Good News of Salvation. This Pentecost, let us pray that we be awakened to great power in us by the Holy Spirit and use it to bear witness to Christ.

## Funeral Luncheon Committee

Saint Cristóbal Magallanes Jara, also known as Christopher Magallanes is a martyr and saint venerated in the Catholic Church who was killed without trial on the way to say Mass during the Cristero War after the trumped up charge of inciting rebellion. He was born in Totatiche, Jalisco, Mexico on July 30, 1869. He was son of Rafael Magallanes and Clara Jara, who were farmers. He worked as a shepherd in his youth and enrolled in the Conciliar Seminary of San José in Guadalajara at the age of 19.

He was ordained at the age of 30 at the Santa Teresa Temple in Guadalajara and subsequently served as chaplain of the School of Arts and Works of the Holy Spirit in Guadalajara. He was then designated as the parish priest for his home town of Totatiche, where he helped found schools, carpentry shops and the planning of hydrological works including the dam of La Candelaria.

He took special interest in the evangelization of the local indigenous Huichol people and was instrumental in the foundation of the mission in the indigenous town of Azqueltán. When government decrees shut down the seminary in Guadalajara in 1914, Fr Magallanes offered to open a seminary in his parish. In July 1915, he opened the Auxiliar Seminary of Totatiche, which quickly achieved a student body of 17 students by the following year and was recognized by the Archbishop of Guadalajara, José Francisco Orozco y Jiménez, who appointed a precept and two professors to the seminary.

Magallanes wrote and preached against armed rebellion, but was falsely accused of promoting the Cristero Rebellion in the area. Arrested on May 21, 1927, while en route to celebrate Mass at a farm, he gave away his few remaining possessions to his executioners, gave them absolution, and without a trial, he was martyred four days later with Saint Agustín Caloca in Colotlán, Jalisco. His last words to his executioners were "I die innocent, and ask God that my blood may serve to unite my Mexican brethren."

He was succeeded as parish priest of Totatiche by Fr José Pilar Quezada Valdés, who went on to become the first bishop of the Archdiocese of Acapulco.

Fr Magallanes was canonized by Pope John Paul II on May 21, 2000.

He is celebrated in the Roman Catholic Church with an optional memorial on 21 May.

In the movie For Greater Glory, Fr Magallanes is portrayed by actor Peter O'Toole.
