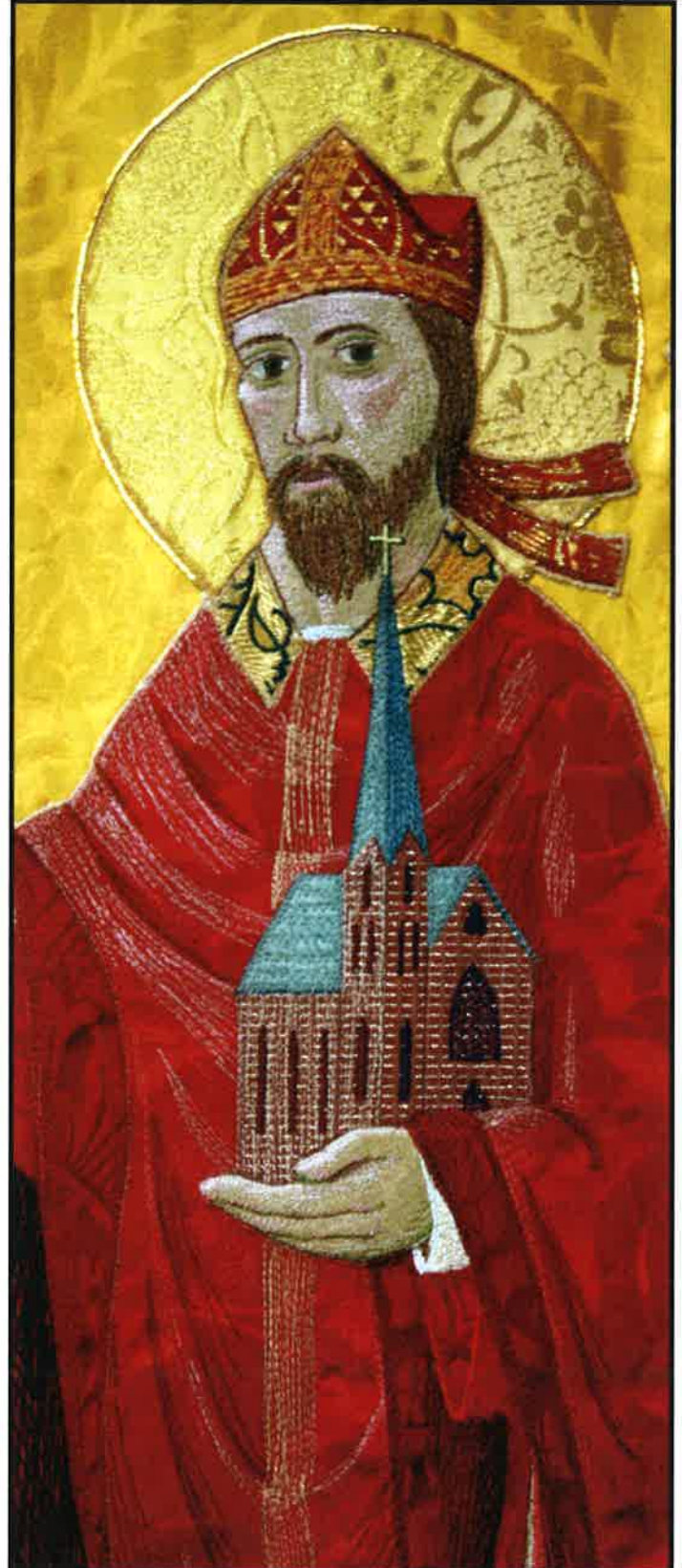

St. Lawrence (Feast Day August 10th)

The esteem in which the Church holds Lawrence is seen in the fact that today's celebration ranks as a feast. We know very little about his life. He is one of those whose martyrdom made a deep and lasting impression on the early Church. Celebration of his feast day spread rapidly.

He was a Roman deacon under Pope Saint Sixtus II. Four days after this pope was put to death, Lawrence and four clerics suffered martyrdom, probably during the persecution of the Emperor Valerian.

Legendary details of Lawrence's death were known to Damasus, Prudentius, Ambrose, and Augustine. The church built over his tomb became one of the seven principal churches in Rome and a favorite place for Roman pilgrimages.

A well-known legend has persisted from earliest times. As deacon in Rome, Lawrence was charged with the responsibility for the material goods of the Church, and the distribution of alms to the poor. When Lawrence knew he would be arrested like the pope, he sought out the poor, widows, and orphans of Rome and gave them all the money he had on hand, selling even the sacred vessels of the altar to increase the sum. When the prefect of Rome heard of this, he imagined that the Christians must have considerable treasure. He sent for Lawrence and said, "You Christians say we are cruel to you, but that is not what I have in mind. I am told that your priests offer in gold, that the sacred blood is received in silver cups, that you have golden candlesticks at your evening services. Now, your doctrine says you must render to Caesar what is his. Bring these treasures—the emperor needs them to maintain his forces. God does not cause money to be counted: He brought none of it into the world with him—only words. Give me the money, therefore, and be rich in words."

Lawrence replied that the Church was indeed rich. "I will show you a valuable part. But give me time to set everything in order and make an inventory." After three days he gathered a great number of blind, lame, maimed, leprous, orphaned, and widowed persons and put them in rows. When the prefect arrived, Lawrence simply said, "These are the treasure of the Church."

The prefect was so angry he told Lawrence that he would indeed have his wish to die—but it would be by inches. He had a great gridiron prepared with coals beneath it, and had Lawrence's body placed on it. After the martyr had suffered the pain for a long time, the legend concludes, he made his famous cheerful remark, "It is well done. Turn me over!"



We have a neat connection to St. Lawrence in this parish because we have a relic of his in our altar. So, like last year we will be doing the novena to St. Lawrence beginning on August 1st and concluding on August 9th. We will celebrate the Feast of St. Lawrence at the 5:30pm Mass as usual on Tuesday the 10th. And we will have a special Traditional Latin Mass on Monday the 9th at 9am.

Novena to St. Lawrence

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Glorious St Lawrence, model of Christian fortitude, I implore you in your loving kindness to pray for me before the throne of God. To you I have recourse in the problems that daily surround me. Shield me against my selfishness and my indifference to God and my neighbor. Inspire me to imitate your Christian virtues. May your blessing be with me always, so that I may see and serve Christ in others and work for His Kingdom. Graciously obtain for me from God those favors and graces which I need so much in the trials, miseries and afflictions in life, particularly...

Reminder of the Mass Setting Changes

RFor the things that are 'routine' and familiar, we humans tend to like them to remain the same. They never do, of course, but it's our preference. It has always been a guiding rule here at St. Colman that the music should always be consistent, as consistent as the content of the Mass itself. While the Mass itself remains a constant, on a weekly, yea, daily basis, the music that carries certain parts is permitted to change. This is especially true for the sections of the Mass which are called the 'ordinal', meaning those parts that are always the same: namely, Kyrie (Lord, have mercy), Gloria (Glory to God), Credo (I believe), Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy) and Agnus Dei (Lamb of God). At St. Colman we have used a setting since Advent of 2010 for all but the Credo called "Mass in Honor of St. Benedict". That was when the new English translation of the Mass started being used. This particular setting was chosen as a common setting for the Diocese of Columbus and we have continued to use it. It is musically acceptable and, as a congregation, we sing it well. While we switch the setting for Advent and Lent (to something more stylistically suited to the penitential seasons), we have otherwise stayed with the 'St. Benedict'.

Both Fr. Haddad and I believe that it is time to add to our repertoire. We will continue to use the 'St. Benedict', most likely in the more festive seasons, but beginning this weekend, we will be learning a new setting.

The 'Mass in Honor of St. Thomas More' by Fr. Samuel Weber, will be introduced and we will start by using the Sanctus and the Agnus Dei from this setting that weekend. There will be a brief introduction before the Masses that weekend. Later on, once we're comfortable with it, we will add the Gloria. A great deal of searching and thought has gone into this selection. I hope you will find it easy to learn and easy to sing. Its style is very much in keeping with the plainsong (Gregorian chant) that is the standard for use in the Church. It will permit us to place copies in the pew (whereas, if you don't already know the 'St. Benedict' right now, you're out of luck).

I've been Music Director at St. Colman for 16 years and we've changed the Mass setting we use just once in that time. I hope we are able to continue our tradition of full and active participation in the Mass with this new setting.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation and continued praise of Almighty God in song!

Robert L. VanDyke, 88, of Washington Court House, Ohio died Wednesday, July 28, 2021, at 9:25 p.m. at his home following an extended illness.

He was born June 26, 1933, in Pike County, Ohio to Walter and Nellie Mossbarger VanDyke. He was a 1952 graduate of Fairfield High School in Leesburg. He had formerly lived in Pike County and Greenfield but spent most of his life in this community.

He was a letter carrier for the United States Postal Service for 38 years before his retirement in 1994. He then was a maintenance worker at the Carnegie Public Library where he enjoyed the companionship of his co-workers and many friends.
