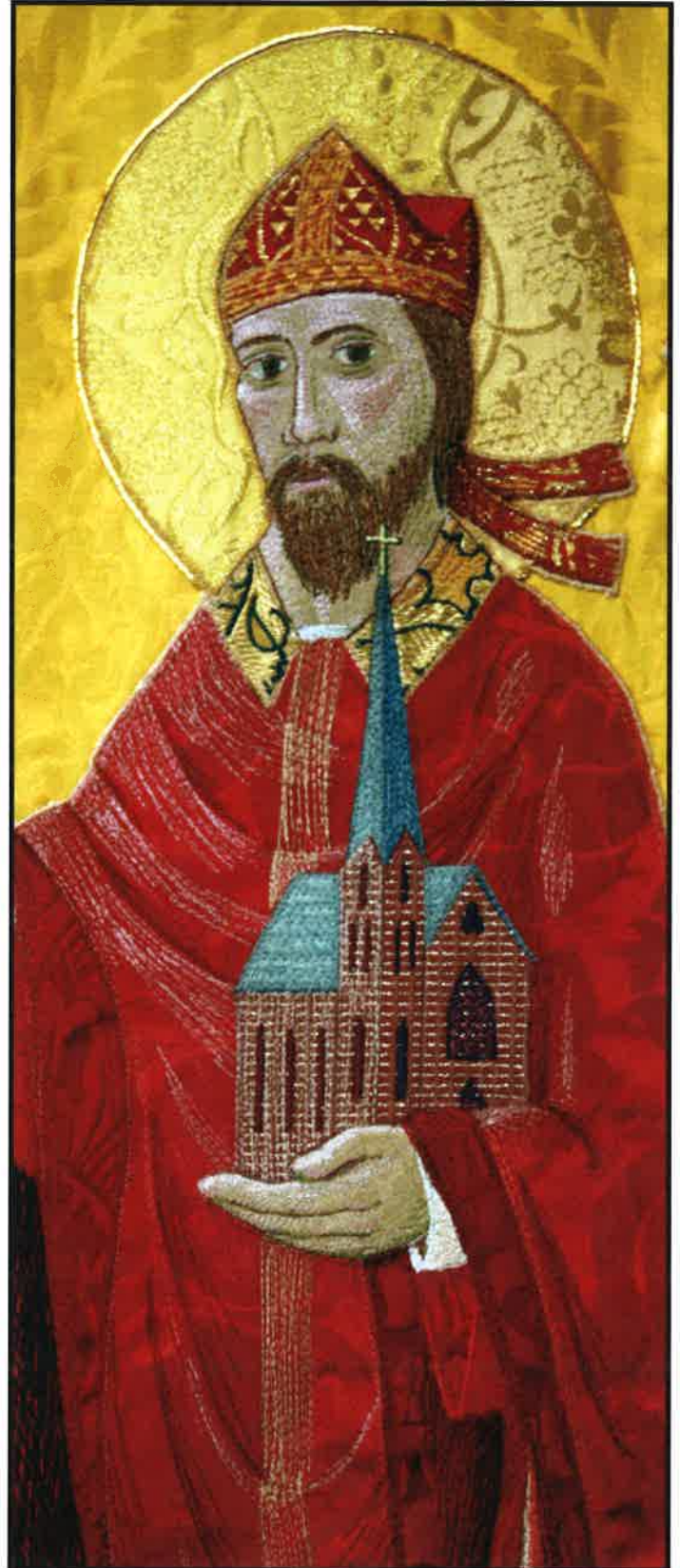

Our third Capital Improvement collection is next weekend. As reported earlier in the year, this collection will be applied directly to the tuck pointing project on the church.

Soon you will see Legacy Restoration working on the front of the church to repair a portion of the roof causing much of our water and tuck pointing damage in the front. This will help to maintain the brick until the funds are raised for the tuck pointing project.

From the Pastor's Desk...

The ten commandments are given by God and are indisputable and absolutely necessary to follow for salvation. Recently, some have claimed that they do not need to follow the ten commandments as absolutes, because salvation is from Jesus.

There are several problems with this. First, I would ask, "which of commandments can be broken without sin?"

Here's a list:

1. You shall have no other gods before Me.
2. You shall not use God's Name in vain.
3. You shall honor the Sabbath.
4. You shall honor your mother and your father.
5. You shall not kill.
6. You shall not commit adultery.
7. You shall not steal.
8. You shall not bear false witness.
9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.
10. You shall not covet you neighbor's possessions.

Again, breaking which of these is not a sin? This is an absurdity to even ask.

Second, to claim that one's salvation is from Jesus, so one does not have to follow the ten commandments is wildly presumptuous. It is to say, "I know which commandments Jesus doesn't think are necessary." The ego to make this claim is unimaginable.

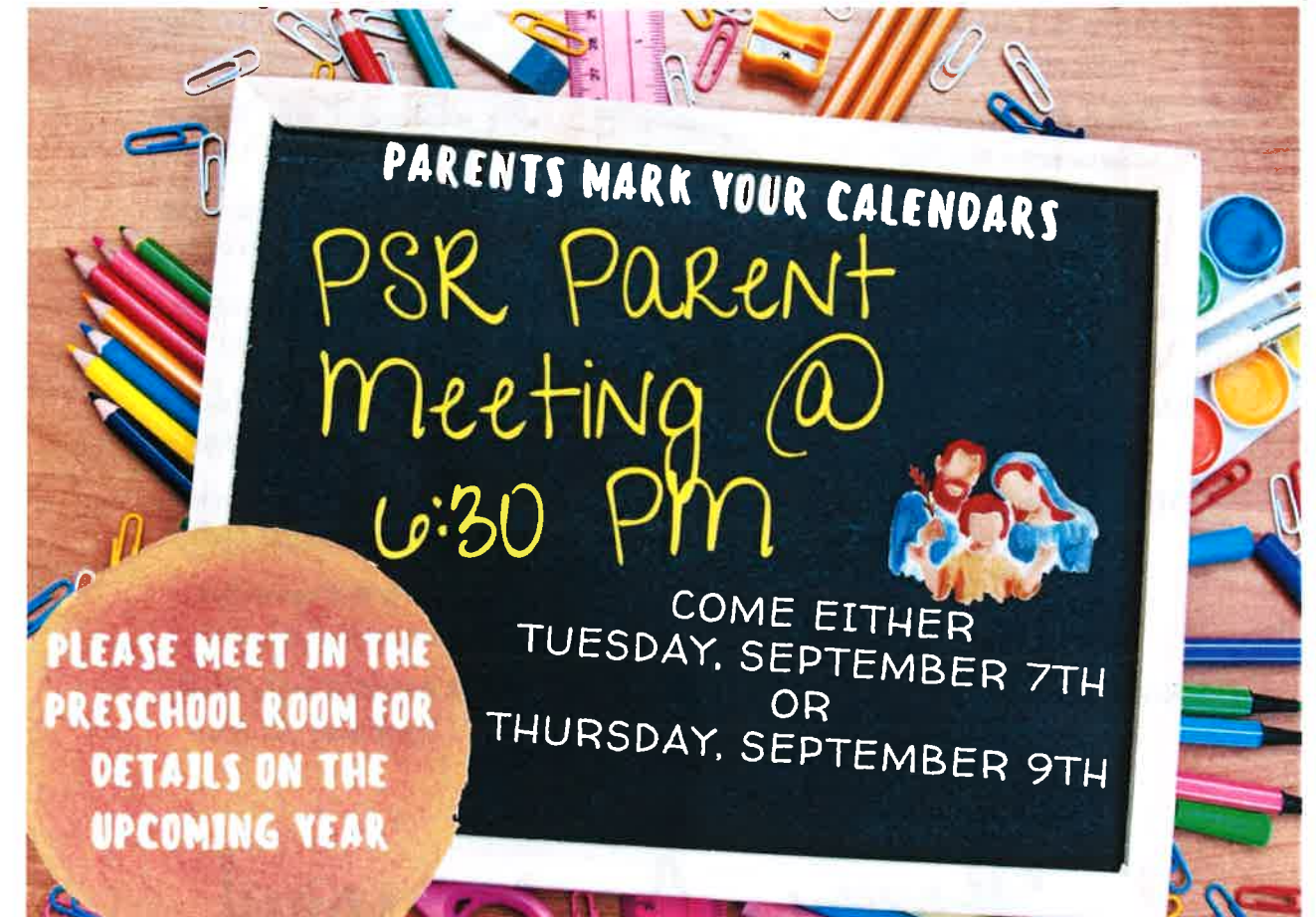
Finally, Jesus explicitly says to follow the commandments. In the *Gospel according to Matthew*, chapter nineteen, the rich young man asks Jesus, "Teacher, what good must I do to gain eternal life?" (v. 16) Our Lord responds with, "If you wish to enter into life, keep the commandments." (v. 17) This is not ambiguous.

Some will say, "What about charity? Is it not the love of God and neighbor that we need to inherit eternal life?" Indeed, Our Lord does give us the two greatest commandments: "He said to him, 'You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'" (Matthew 20:37-39) Of these two greatest commandments, Our Lord says, "The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments." (Matthew 20:40)

This does not mean if you love God and your neighbor, you can do anything. Rather, it means that the commandments are necessary to follow. If you are to have any hope of loving God, you must follow these commandments. The first three are about treating God and the last seven are about how to treat your neighbor. To violate the first three commandments is to fail to love God. To violate any of the others is to fail to love your neighbor. God gave us these commandments not to burden us, but to teach us how to love Him. We as Christians are called to more than follow the commandments. Indeed, we are called to perfection. But we will leave that for another day. Today, we will remind ourselves of the important role that the commandments play in our spiritual growth and that it is not permissible to transgress them no matter what anyone anywhere may say or do.
